

Who can claim this credit?

- **You may claim** – this credit if the home was transferred after the January 1, 2016 certification date and if the previous owner used this property as a primary residence on January 1, 2016.
- **You cannot claim this credit if the home was:**
 - Not the primary residence of the previous owner on January 1, 2016
 - Used as rental property on January 1, 2016
 - Unoccupied on January 1, 2016
