BE IT RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the salaries of the Racine County Clerk, Racine County Treasurer, and Racine County Register of Deeds who will take office on January 1, 2009 shall be as follows:

Salary Effective January 1, 2009	\$ 68,344
Salary Effective January 1, 2010	\$ 69,711
Salary Effective January 1, 2011	\$ 71,105
Salary Effective January 1, 2012	\$ 72,527

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that this resolution shall not change any existing resolutions concerning benefits to be paid to the holder of the above described offices.

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17 **WHEREAS**, there is a need to establish salaries for various elected officials for
18 the next term of office; and

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20 **WHEREAS**, the individuals elected to the positions of County Clerk, County
21 Treasurer, and Register of Deeds in November 2008 will hold office for terms of four
22 years; and

24 **WHEREAS**, Resolution 99-81 established the principle that the salaries of these
25 elected county officials should be set and maintained at levels in keeping with the
26 responsibilities and duties of their respective offices; and

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28 **WHEREAS**, Resolution 99-81 established the principle that the salaries of these
29 elected county officials should be set at the mid-points of the respective non-
30 represented pay grades associated with their offices; that is, Grade 4; and

32 **WHEREAS**, in order to ensure that these elected county officials continue to be
33 compensated at levels commensurate with their service to the county, it is necessary to
34 make provision for modest regular increases in their salaries during their terms of office.
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
