WHEREAS, drug court programs in various locations in Wisconsin and elsewhere employ positive behavioral incentives, including but not limited to, bus passes, food coupons, movie passes, etc., as an additional method of encouraging participant compliance with court-ordered conditions; and

6	WHEREAS, Racine County currently has a pilot program for a Drug and Alcohol Court,
7	within the Racine County Circuit Court, that is coordinated by an inter-agency Drug and Alcohol
8	Court Team; and

10	WHEREAS, the Racine County Drug and Alcohol Court team believes that the program
11	would benefit from the availability of positive behavioral incentives of the types used by drug
12	courts elsewhere; and
13	
14	WHEREAS, however small the incentives may be, they are not without cost and as
15	such, there is currently no funding source exclusively designed for purchases of incentives; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, community groups and churches have expressed interest in soliciting
18	contributions from their membership for the specific purpose of donating to the County to further

the stated program goals of the Drug and Alcohol Court, including the acquisitions of non-

monetary incentives.

Any Funds received from the Community towards the Drug & Alcohol Court will be placed into a new account - Donations Drug & Alcohol Court within the Community Service Department - Jail Alternatives.

A revenue transfer will occur automatically to a new non-lapsing accounts - D&A Court Materials.
