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13 **WHEREAS**, WRC has moved the program to a new site; and

14 **WHEREAS**, WRC receives funds from United Way for its core shelter functions,
15 but United Way has concluded that it is unable to provide funding for Hand to Hand; and

16 **WHEREAS**, The County Executive proposes to provide Hand to Hand with
17 \$20,000, which is enough to keep it operating at its current level through the end of
18 2006; and

19 **WHEREAS**, The County Executive has notified WRC that it needs to find other
20 funding sources, and the WRC has announced its determination to do so; and

21 **WHEREAS**, WRC will soon begin charging fees, for the exchange and
22 supervised visitation services, that more accurately reflect costs of operations than the
23 nominal fees it now levies.
