RESOLUTION BY THE FINANCE AND HUMAN RESOURCES COMMITTEE AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE WISCONSIN WINS UNDERAGE TOBACCO SALES PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS WITHIN THE SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT'S 2005 BUDGET

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the participation of the Racine County Sheriff's Department in the Wisconsin Wins Underage Tobacco Sale Program which is funded by the State of Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services through the Caledonia/Mount Pleasant Health Departments is authorized and approved and said participation shall consist of the following:

1. The program consists of trained underage individuals from 15 to 17 years old who are participating in compliance checks at various licensed establishments throughout the County, but specifically in the Towns of Mount Pleasant and Caledonia.

2. The agents and their guardians will be required to sign a permission release form before youths can participate in the program. Said youths will attempt to purchase cigarettes in various licensed establishments and the compliance of these establishments will be checked by plain clothed deputy sheriffs.

3. The Sheriff's Department shall bill the Caledonia/Mount Pleasant Health Departments for their work on this project.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the transfer of funds as set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein are authorized and approved.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the execution of any contract, agreements or other documents necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution is authorized and approved and that any two of the County Clerk, the County Executive and/or the County Board Chairman are authorized to execute any of said documents.
