## **INFORMATION ONLY**

**WHEREAS**, Section 66.1001 of the Wisconsin Statutes sets forth requirements for the preparation of county and local comprehensive plans; and

**WHEREAS**, the comprehensive planning law effectively requires that comprehensive plans be completed and adopted by counties, cities, villages and towns before January 1, 2010 in order for a county or local government to engage in zoning, subdivision control or other land use related regulations and activities; and

**WHEREAS**, a cooperative approach among Racine County, local governments interested in partnering with the County, and the SEWRPC will result in the preparation of County and local comprehensive plans that meet State requirements and local, County, and regional needs in an efficient and cost-effective manner; and

**WHEREAS**, a proposed cooperative multi-jurisdictional planning process was described during a Racine County Elected Officials meeting held on April 22, 2004, whereby the County would contract with SEWRPC to develop a County comprehensive plan and comprehensive plans for participating local governments; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed multi-jurisdictional planning process was reviewed and approved by the Economic Development and Land Use Planning Committee during a meeting held on September 7, 2005; and

**WHEREAS**, Racine County will apply for a 2006 Comprehensive Planning Grant from the Wisconsin Department of Administration under Chapter Adm. 48 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code to help fund preparation of the multi-jurisdictional comprehensive plan, with required matching funds to be provided by the County and SEWRPC.
