**WHEREAS**, the criminal justice system in Racine County is a complex system that requires close coordination among numerous stakeholders; and

**WHEREAS**, the prompt and efficient administration of justice, as well as the effective operation of alternatives to incarceration can benefit from a perspective that takes into account the various interests that are served by the system; and

**WHEREAS**, the various components of the system can benefit from the observations and recommendations of an individual who is not directly responsible to any major stakeholder; and

**WHEREAS**, several other Wisconsin counties have created positions of criminal justice coordinators, and it has been recommended that Racine County do likewise; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 2005-58 calls for evaluation of all jail alternative programs/projects funded by Racine County, a responsibility that would be appropriate for a criminal justice program coordinator.
