BRAUN ROAD SOUTH site containing approximately 39.3 acres of land located in the Village of Mount Pleasant, to Wilks Bros Farms at the bid price of \$226.00 per acre for a total of \$8,881.80 per year (Four Year Total \$35,527.20).

CASE EAGLE PARK site consisting of two parcels containing a total of 51.6 acres of land located in the Village of Rochester, to Steve Henningfield Farms, LLC at the bid price of \$252.00 per acre for a total of \$13,003.20 per year (Four Year Total \$52,012.80).
