19	Area Drug Operations Group (SEADOG) which is a consortium of five counties (Racine,
20	Kenosha, Walworth, Jefferson, and Dodge) collaborating to fight illegal drug operations in
21	southeast Wisconsin; and

23	WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Justice has been approved as recipient
24	of the 2017 Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Office Meth Task Force Grant
25 26	and SEADOG has been invited to participate in the grant; and
27	WHEREAS, DCI will reimburse to each participating County/Task Force/Agency for
28	overtime expenses associated with the development and investigation of narcotics cases
29	that target the illicit trafficking of methamphetamine; and
30	that target the infert tramoking of methamphetamine, and
31	WHEREAS, each agency must provide monthly investigative reports relating to
32	methamphetamine arrests/use/sales, statistical data, as well as utilizing ACISS as the
33	investigative case management system; and

35	WHEREAS, SEADOG Agencies have been allotted \$20,000.00 (shared) per year
36	for the two-year grant period; and

38	WHEREAS, there is no match requirement for Racine County.

Racine County will be particiapating in the COPS Meth task force, this grant if for reimbursement of overtime expenses related to those kings of investiations.

The multi jurisdictional grant has been allocated \$20,000 for each of the two years of the grant.

The grant will only cover overtime wages not including fringe benefits.

Revenue received for the Meth Task Force will be deposited into account 11800000.302185 - DOJ - Anti Meth Task Force.

Via a Monthly revenue transfer these funds will be budgeted into 11800000.401125 - Overtime Wages 11800000.451000 - Equipment
