Uihlein/Tiny Hooves, Inc., a non-profit animal rescue and sanctuary (DBA Tiny Hooves, Inc.), providing shelter for approximately 104 rescued farm animals; located in the A-2 Farming and Residential District II; 1117 N. Britton Road; Sec. 12, T3N, R20E, Town of Dover: Parcel Id. No. 006032012010000

Brian Jensen reviewed the petition and public hearing testimony using text and maps. In 1998, the Economic Development and Land Use Committee and the Town of Dover approved a conditional use to allow a horse boarding and training operation on this site. In 2005, the conditional use was amended to allow up to 38 horses. The manure storage and disposal plan has been reviewed by Racine County Land Conservation. Rebecca Thompson and her mother will reside in the three-bedroom single-family home on the property. The Town of Dover Plan Commission and Town Board approved this request at their October 10, 2018, meeting.

Lawrence Barry, speaking on behave of Richard Uihlein, and Rebecca Thompson, founder and president of Tiny Hooves Rescue, were present and answered questions from the committee.
