## FOR INFORMATION:

## STREET VACATION PROCESS

(Procedure is only used when vacating lands along a county highway; no county action is required for vacating platted lands on a town road.)

- 1. The County Clerk or Economic Development and Land Use Planning Committee (EDLUPC) receives a written petition for a discontinuance of a public way (i.e., street vacation).
- 2. The applicant must record a Notice of Pendency (lis pendens) of such application, containing the person's name, a brief statement of the object thereof and a map and description of the land that is affected with the Racine County Register of Deeds Office. (s. 840.11, Wis. Stats.) A copy of the recorded document must be filed with the Development Services Office before proceeding to the next step.
- 3. The petition is scheduled as a committee action item on the next available Economic Development and Land Use Planning Committee (EDLUPC) agenda.
- 4. If the EDLUPC approves the street vacation in concept, staff prepares a resolution and forwards it to the County Board for 1<sup>st</sup> reading.
- 5. The County Board then refers the street vacation request back to the EDLUPC for a public hearing. The public hearing must be held not less than 40 days after the 1<sup>st</sup> reading at the County Board meeting. [s.66.1003(4)(b), Wis. Stats.]
- 6. A Class Three notice must be published in three separate weeks, with the last publication being one week before the public hearing.
- 7. Abutting property owners must be served notice at least 30 days prior to the public hearing. [s. 66.1003(4)(b), Wis. Stats.]
- 8. If any written objection is filed with the County Clerk by any abutting property owner or by owners of more than one-third of the lands that lie 2,650 feet on either end of the portion sought to be discontinued (vacated), the County Board may <u>not</u> act on the resolution. [s. 66.1003(4)(c), Wis. Stats.]
- 9. After the public hearing, the Committee refers the resolution back to the County Board for their action.
- 10. If approved, the applicant must obtain a certified copy of the adopted resolution from the County Clerk and record it with the Racine County Register of Deeds.
