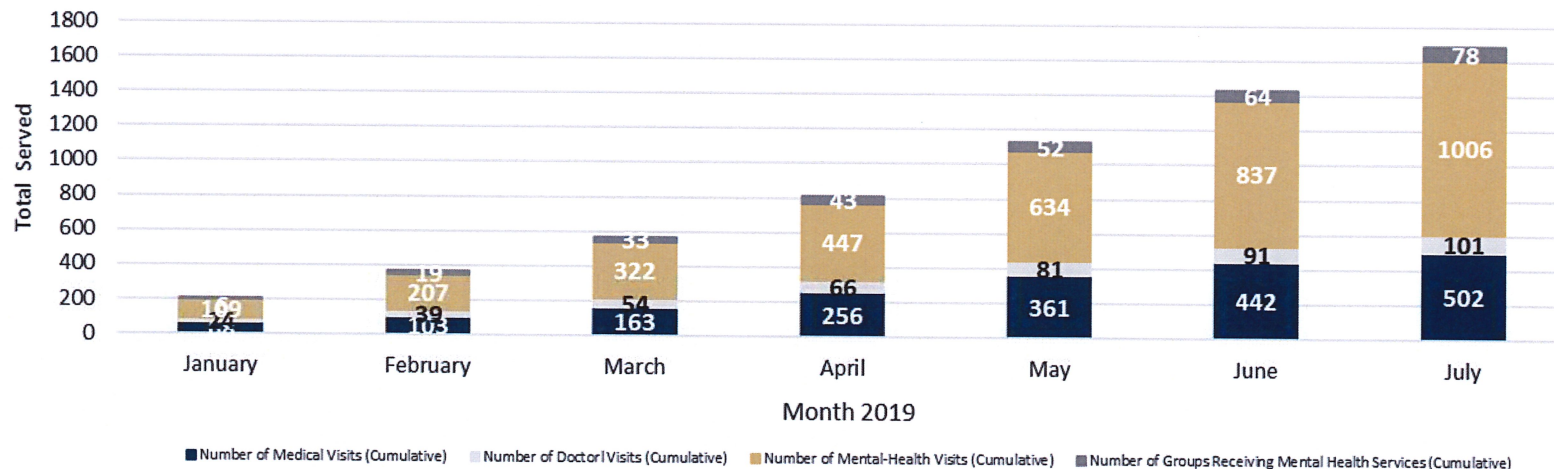

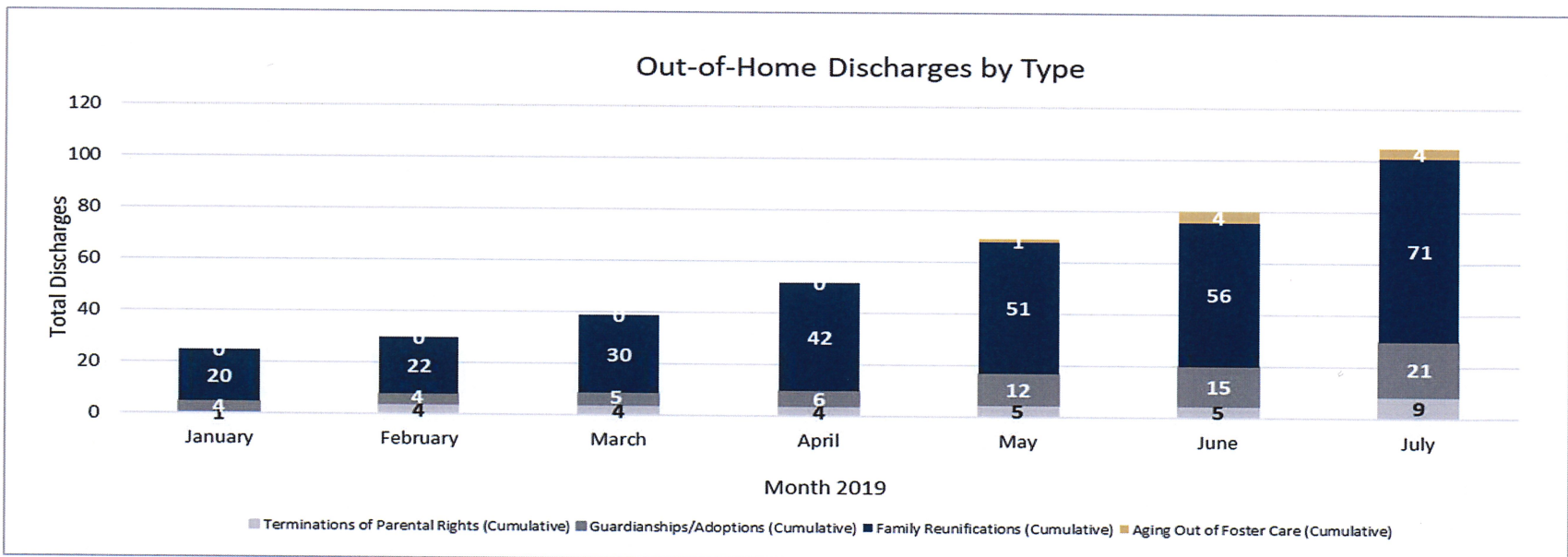
Out-of-home care discharges in 2018



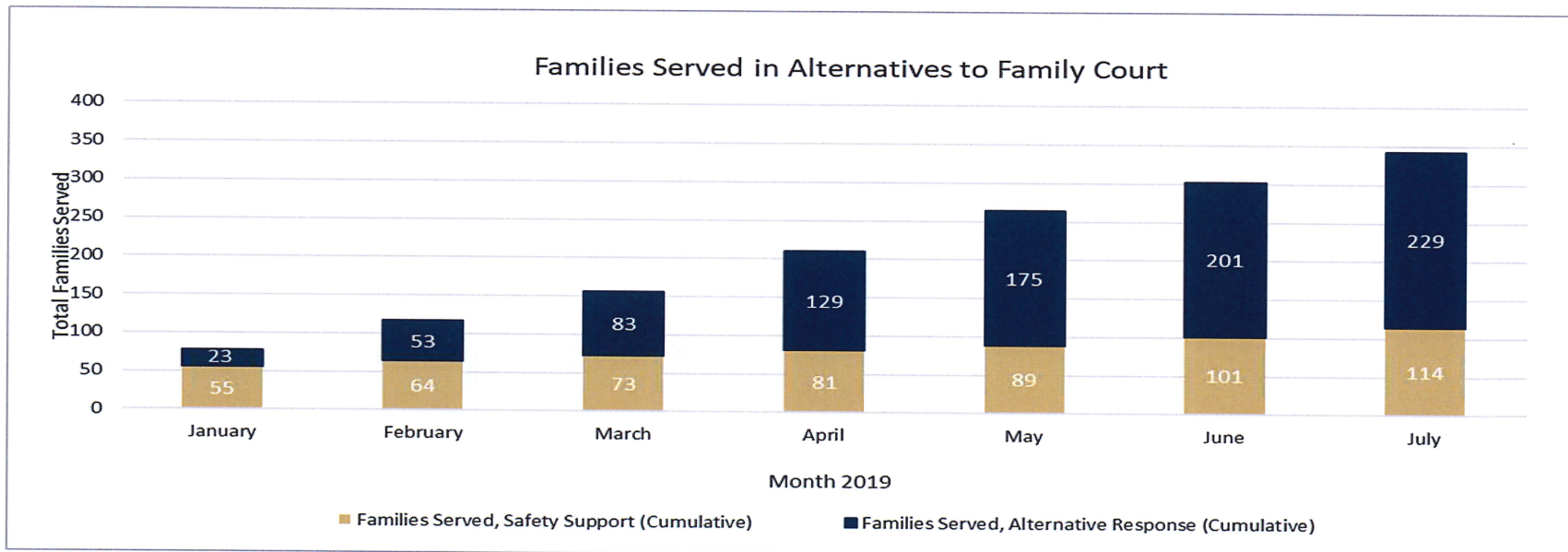
