Tim Grove - Tim is the chief clinical officer at Saint A. He is responsible for the implementation of Saint A's trauma informed care philosophy and practices, including spearheading the implementation of Dr. Bruce Perry's Neurosequential Model of Therapeutics (NMT). Tim developed the trauma informed care training curriculum of how best to understand and implement trauma informed care. Tim has been training and consulting for the past 10 years in Wisconsin and with groups from across the country, teaching diverse professionals and caregivers. Judge Triggiano has been a Milwaukee County Circuit Court Judge since 2004. She presides over the Family Drug Treatment Court and is Deputy Chief Judge for Milwaukee County Circuit Courts. Judge Triggiano has been involved in numerous committees and has given countless presentations addressing childhood trauma, trauma informed care, domestic violence, child well-being, child welfare law, safety and permanence, infant mental health, evidence-based sentencing practices, evidence-based responses to drug and alcohol use, family drug treatment courts, juvenile delinquency. Judge Triggiano has been a member of the National Council on Juvenile & Family Court Judges for over 10 years and is a Project ONE Co-Leader and co-chair of the Milwaukee Model Court Collaborative Team.
