WHEREAS, this matter was the subject of a worker's compensation claim filed by Andre McWhorter, a former Machine Operator from 1998 to 2017, who was injured in a motor vehicle accident on October 26, 2016; and

WHEREAS, based upon the medical reports, the County was required to concede one year of TTD for \$67,949.85, subrogated medical expenses of \$1,491.58 and up to \$9,975.66 in unpaid medical expenses; and

WHEREAS, a settlement has been negotiated between the Human Resources Department and outside counsel with Andre McWhorter and his counsel, Fortune & McGillis, S.C.; and

WHEREAS, the \$222,500.00 settlement amount will be in exchange for a Limited Compromise Agreement resolving all of Andre McWhorter worker's compensation claims with the exception of his right to claim future medical expenses for his alleged spine injury.
