RESOLUTION BY THE GOVERNMENT SERVICES COMMITTEE AUTHORIZING RACINE COUNTY TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF RACINE FOR THE PLACEMENT OF A PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALK SIGN ON WISCONSIN AVENUE

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that Racine County is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the City of Racine to display a portable crosswalk yield sign in the painted mid-block crosswalk of Wisconsin Avenue between Seventh Street and Eight Street and said final agreement will be on file with the County Clerk.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the execution of the agreement and any addenda shall be subject to the review and approval of the Corporation Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the County Clerk, the County Board Chairman and/or the County Executive are authorized to execute any contracts or contract addenda to carry out the intent of this resolution.

20 **WHEREAS**, the Racine County Executive Safety Committee determined the
21 placement of a mid-block pedestrian crosswalk sign would improve the safety of our
22 employees and all pedestrians crossing Wisconsin Avenue between the Courthouse and
23 LEC during our regular business hours of operation.

25 **WHEREAS**, the Racine County Executive Safety Committee staff approached the
26 City of Racine requesting permission to place the pedestrian crosswalk sign, and by
27 Resolution No. 15-0275 of July 7, 2015, the Common Council of the City of Racine
28 granted permission for the display of the sign provided that Racine County enter into a
29 suitable agreement with the City of Racine covering the restrictions set forth in §66.0425
30 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

32 **WHEREAS**, the Racine County Corporation Counsel will review and approve the
33 agreement including the indemnity and hold harmless language requested by the City of
34 Racine.
