RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE **May 13, 2020**

Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 1,381,696

Wisconsin: 10,902

Central Racine County Health Department: 282 confirmed (95 probable); 12 deaths

City of Racine Public Health Department: 538 confirmed (plus 73 probable); 5 deaths

Racine County total: 820 confirmed (168 probable); 17 deaths

Note: Probable cases are symptomatic individuals who have not been tested but are presumed positive because they had direct contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19, or whose COVID-19 test results were inconclusive.

Central Racine County and City of Racine Health Departments

The Department of Health Services (DHS) has released the names of skilled nursing facilities (nursing homes) with active COVID-19 facility-wide public health investigations.
