WHEREAS, on January 24, 2020, a low hanging power line connected to the home of Dalton Addis was struck by a Racine County snowplow; and

WHEREAS, the height of plow 77, driven by Racine County Public Works and Development Services driver Steven Labinski on January 24, 2020, is 11'7"; and

WHEREAS, the Safety Rules for Overhead Lines requires that the minimum height for power lines in residential areas is 15'5"; and

WHEREAS, upon investigation, it was determined that the power line was hanging lower than the height safety rule of 15'5" due to the wet, heavy snow; and

WHEREAS, plow driver Labinski indicated that he did not have the plow box raised as he was driving past Addis's home and the low hanging power line struck the plow and was subsequently pulled from Addis's home; and

WHEREAS, there is no evidence to indicate that the plow box was raised as it drove past Addis's home and it is against protocol for plow operators to drive with the box raised as doing so would result in salt spilling over the back tailgate; and

WHEREAS, the incident was caused by a low hanging WE Energy power line and an "Act of God," and a not by negligence or misconduct on the part of Racine County; and

WHEREAS, based on the findings by the Racine County Public Works and Development Services Department and the Racine County Corporation Counsel Office, a denial is recommended.
