**WHEREAS**, on Sunday, February 2, 2020, Marcus Lang backed his vehicle into a parking space at the west end of the empty parking lot at the Racine County Dennis Kornwolf Service Center located at 1717 Taylor Avenue, Racine, Wisconsin; and

**WHEREAS**, Marcus Lang claims a metal pole was in the ground next to the parking spot and that when he pulled out of the spot to leave, that the pole scraped the side of his vehicle causing damage in the amount of \$994.23; and

**WHEREAS**, the Office of the Corporation Counsel investigated the claim and found that Marcus Lang had no official business in the Dennis Kornwolf Service Center on the day of the incident; and

**WHEREAS**, Marcus Lang's actions by choosing to park in a spot next to a pole that was in plain sight and parking in a County lot when the building was closed to the public resulted in his loss, and his negligence is greater than any alleged negligence by the County, and therefore, the Office of the Corporation Counsel and the Public Works and Development Services Department recommend denial of this claim.
