Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 1,734,986

Wisconsin: 17,707

Central Racine County Health Department: 535 confirmed, 118 probable, 5,407 negative, 25 deaths

City of Racine Health Department: 1,175 confirmed, 148 probable, 5,310 negative, 11 deaths

Racine County total: 1,710 confirmed, 266 probable, 10,717 negative, 36 deaths
