## **Confirmed coronavirus cases**

United States: 1,820,523 Wisconsin: 18,917

deaths

City of Racine Health Department: 1,245 confirmed, 150 probable, 5,884 negative, 13 deaths

Racine County total: 1,794 confirmed, 274 probable, 11,911 negative, 40 deaths

Positive test percentage: 13%
