## **RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE** **June 9, 2020**

### **Confirmed coronavirus cases**

United States: 1,968,867

Wisconsin: 21,308

Central Racine County Health Department: 593 confirmed, 130 probable, 8,569 negative, 31 deaths

City of Racine Health Department: 1,361 confirmed, 173 probable, 7,965 negative, 20 deaths

Racine County total: 1,954 confirmed, 303 probable, 16,534 negative, 51 deaths

Positive test percentage: 10.5%

### **Central Racine County and City of Racine Health Departments**

Dr. Robert Redfield, Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, recommends that individuals who have participated in mass gatherings such as protests or demonstrations get tested for COVID-19. This is especially true in areas that still have significant community spread. These gatherings have high potential to spread the virus because of large crowds gathering together, shouting, and marching shoulder-to-shoulder. He advised that participants should get tested 5-7 days after participation to make sure they are not infected. Anyone showing symptoms is encouraged to seek testing immediately and is requested to stay home from work and other activities until they are well.
