Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 6,314,282 confirmed, 894,012 deaths

Wisconsin: 82,477 confirmed, 1,230,159 negative, 1,168 deaths

Updates for the week of September 8:

- Free drive-thru COVID-19 testing will be held Wednesday, Sept. 9 through Friday, Sept. 11 at Festival Hall in Racine, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day. Residents are strongly urged to pre-register by visiting register.covidconnect.wi.gov. Testing may end early depending on availability of test kits. Testing is available to any ages 5 or older (minors must be accompanied by a parent or guardian).
