**WHEREAS**, on August 1, 2020, Jacqueline Larsen was driving Northbound on 90<sup>th</sup> Street and turned Eastbound onto Old Spring Street in Mount Pleasant, Racine County, Wisconsin, and

**WHEREAS**, on August 19, 2020, Jacqueline Larson filed a claim with the Racine County in the amount of \$189.00 for damage to her 2013 Toyota Camry allegedly caused by the painting operation in Mount Pleasant near 90<sup>th</sup> Street & Old Spring Street on August 1, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, Jacqueline Larsen claims that there were no cones in the area of 90<sup>th</sup> Street and Old Spring Street when she drove through the intersection; and

**WHEREAS**, The Racine County Public Works and Development Services Department (PWDS) investigated the matter and found that Ms. Larsen's contributory negligence resulted in her property damage; and

**WHEREAS**, PWDS video shows the painting crew setting out cones on the entire stretch of the segment of roadway being painted and Mt. Pleasant had a worker assisting County staff in removing the cones once the paint was dry; and

**WHEREAS**, PWDS used cones, signage, and followed proper procedure for the paint striping; and

**WHEREAS**, the Office of the Corporation Counsel and PWDS recommend denial of this claim.
