1. Call to Order, Roll Call

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Secretary David Cooke.

4. Review of 2015 Financial Report of Golf Operations

SUPERVISOR MOLNAR MOVED, seconded by Supervisor Maier, to lay over the review of the 2015 Financial Report of Golf Operations. Anderson explained that the final numbers from 2015 were not yet completed or audited and that this would be brought back to the Committee later this spring.

5. Review and consideration of proposed 2016 golf fees and 2016 golf rules and regulations as presented by Peter Eitel, President of H & H Fairway Enterprises, Inc.

Peter Eitel presented proposed fee changes and golf rules and regulations for the 2016 season. The purchase of 60 new golf carts is proposed and approximately \$150,000 will be spent on new equipment in 2015 based on the restructured contract. Fees can only be raised, per the contract, based on the previous year CPI, so only a few fees are being raised for 2015. Fee increases are very modest. A new fee includes a season pass for play that includes a cart.

NOTE: Chair Bay Buske joined the meeting at 5:43 p.m. Secretary Cooke continued to preside over the duration of the meeting after consent by Chair Buske.

- 6. Request by Racine County Sheriff's Office (RCSO) for use of a county park (to be identified) for off-road filming by Destination Polaris/Fox Sports of the RCSO Polaris Ranger (March 14-16, 2016)
- Lt. Shawn Barker presented the request from the Sheriff's Office. A 30-minute television show and interview with Lt. Barker featuring search and rescue footage on County lands will air on Fox Sports, March 14-16, 2016. It was noted that the Kansasville Fire Department also has a Polaris Ranger that may be included in the photo shoot with an appearance by Chief Scott Remer.

7. Review, discussion and possible recommendation on a resolution authorizing the transfer of funds using Performance Based Maintenance (PBM) proceeds to purchase a road widener (shouldering machine) for the Racine County Public Works Fleet Division

David Prott discussed the proposed purchase. After all bids were received, it was determined that the machine that best fit the requirements of the department will cost \$6,000.00 more than was originally

budgeted. Proceeds from last year's PBM projects will cover the shortfall; therefore, there would be sufficient money available for the purchase of the road widener (shouldering machine).

8. Review, discussion and possible recommendation on a resolution authorizing and approving a sole source capital equipment purchase with proceeds from the 2015 Capital Equipment Account to purchase a snow plow for the Racine County Public Works Fleet Division

David Prott discussed the proposed purchase and use of funds. A plow blade on one of the department's tandem axle trucks was damaged and it isn't cost effective to repair due to the age of the equipment. There are sufficient funds from last year's Capital Equipment account that could be used for the purchase a new snow plow. The cracked plow blade will be scrapped or listed on the Wisconsin Surplus website.

Nathan Plunkett introduced this item and summarized the realignment project. Supervisor Molnar asked if the existing parking lanes north of Highway 38 have been taken into consideration for use as a place for anglers to park since that area of the Root River is a popular place to fish. Staff advised that the creation of a new parking area would be considered outside the scope of this WISDOT/County project but that it could be considered as a future project with grant dollars from the WIDNR.
