RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE **January 11, 2020**

Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 22,515,032 confirmed, 375,239 deaths

Wisconsin: 508,346 confirmed, 2,405,734 negative, 5,162 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 9,821 confirmed (+587 from last week), 1,444 probable (+148), 59,659 negative (+1468), 176 deaths (+17)

City of Racine Health Department: 7,233 confirmed (+293 from last week), 837 probable (+45), 42,507 negative (+572), 93 deaths (+4)

Racine County total: 17,054 confirmed (+880 from last week), 2,281 probable (+193), 102,166 negative (+2,040), 269 deaths (+21)

- The Wisconsin National Guard is conducting drive-thru COVID-19 testing sites in Racine County at the following locations:
 - Wednesdays through March 10, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Racine County Fairgrounds, 19805 Durand Ave., Union Grove. Vehicles should enter the fairgrounds from Main Street.
 - Thursdays through March 4, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Festival Hall, 5 Fifth St., Racine. Vehicles should enter at 11th Street and Main Street.
- The City of Racine Health Department released a revised version of the City's "Safer Racine" ordinance which will allow schools to reopen buildings and some venues to increase capacity limits. [Read more here](#).
