INFORMATION ONLY

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2021 at approximately 1:30 am, Tatyana Stovall was booked into the Racine County Jail, posted her own bond, and released at approximately1:50 am; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stovall had several personal property items on her person which were inventoried and logged into ProPhoenix; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stovall signed the CMS Inmate Property Receipts printout upon her release indicating that all of her personal property items were returned to her; and

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2021, Ms. Stovall filed a claim with Racine County in the amount of \$1,200,00 for missing property, specifically jewelry and an Apple watch; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stovall claimed that none of her property was returned to her when she was released; and

WHEREAS, the Racine County Sheriff's Office investigated the matter and, by reviewing facility and body worn camera footage, found that Ms. Stovall's property was returned to her when she was released from the Racine County Jail; and

WHEREAS, Stovall's property is clearly seen in a plastic bag which was handed to Stovall at the release counter; and

WHEREAS, it should be noted that Stovall claims she was booked in with a necklace but there was no necklace listed on her property inventory, though the other items she alleges were not returned to her are listed; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stovall did not voice any concerns about missing property to staff during the release process; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation Counsel and the Sheriff's office have investigated this claim and recommend denial.
