1 2 3 Res No. 2021-119 Page Two INFORMATION ONLY 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the current pandemic has highlighted the need for competitive, familysustaining wages; and 7 8 WHEREAS, some of the largest businesses are evaluating their pay structure and 9 providing pay increases to offer at least \$15/hour; and 10 11 WHEREAS, this change prompted the Human Resources team to evaluate the County's 12 current pay grades; and 13 14 WHEREAS, after reviewing the County's current pay grades, Human Resources found that only one pay grade currently falls below \$15/hour; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, by proactively adjusting this pay grade, the County will increase the likelihood it will be able to attract and retain employees; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, with the increase in wages, the County will be better positioned in an ever-21 evolving competitive talent acquisition landscape.

Fiscal Year:

2022

Salary grade N010 will be upgraded to a minimum wage of \$15/hour. This upgrade will have no fiscal impact on Racine County's Budget as the only budgeted employee in the salary grade currently has a wage higher than \$15/hour.
