#### **RESOLUTION 2022-11**

### Requesting the State of Wisconsin to Revise the Current Real Estate Transfer Fee Revenue Sharing Formula

WHEREAS, the collection by counties of a real estate transfer fee was mandated by the State of Wisconsin in 1969, and included a requirement that counties remit 50% of all transfer fees collected to the State; and

WHEREAS, in 1981 the State arbitrarily changed the transfer fee formula to now require counties to remit to the State 80% of all transfer fees collected; and

WHEREAS, the County through the Register of Deeds office assumes the annual operating costs of recording all real estate transfers occurring in Jefferson County, including the collection of real estate transfer fees; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 Jefferson County collected \$1,772,852 in real estate transfer fees with the County's 20% retained share totaling \$354,570, and was required to remit 80% or \$1,418,282 to the State; and

WHEREAS, Jefferson County real estate transfer fee collections over the past five years totaled \$6,922,419 of which the County retained \$1,384,484; and over that same period \$5,537,935 was remitted to the State; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the State of Wisconsin has built up a budget surplus of approximately \$2.5 billion dollars, while many Wisconsin counties continue to struggle financially due to the ever-increasing costs of providing county government services in an inflationary economy, coupled with the financial restrictions imposed by State mandated levy limits; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to financially assist all Wisconsin Counties, Jefferson County requests that the State of Wisconsin return the real estate transfer fee share formula to again allow Wisconsin Counties to retain 50% of all total real estate transfer fees collected, with 50% to be remitted to the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Jefferson County Board of Supervisors in session this 19th day of April, 2022 that the State of Wisconsin is hereby requested to revise the real estate transfer fee share formula to again allow Wisconsin Counties to retain 50% of all real estate transfer fees collected, with 50% to be remitted to the State.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution is sent to Governor Tony Evers, all members of the State Legislature representing Jefferson County, the Wisconsin Counties Association and all other Wisconsin Counties.

#### MONROE COUNTY RESOLUTION ON CLEAN WATER

WHEREAS, the Natural Resources & Extension Committee met on February 9, 2022 and March 9, 2022 to review the Clean Water Resolution and make possible changes; and

WHEREAS, Corporation Counsel provided a draft to the Natural Resources and Extension Committee; and

WHEREAS, there are numerous issues regarding surface & ground water that the citizens of Monroe County are concerned with, including, but not limited to: contamination from nitrates, bacteria, PFAS, lead in drinking water, toxic algae blooms, flooding, an excess sediment & nutrients; and

WHEREAS, the Land Conservation Department is directly involved in local and regional discussions focusing on surface and groundwater issues and is statutorily charged with addressing issues related to these topics.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Monroe County Board of Supervisors establish a right to clean water to protect human health, the environment, and the diverse cultural and natural heritage of Wisconsin for the citizens of Monroe County; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, in recognition of this right to clean water, that actions, policies, plans and procedures of the County of Monroe will reflect the intent to conserve, protect and restore clean water.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Monroe County expects that the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and the members of the Wisconsin Legislature, especially those representing Monroe County, financially support, to the fullest, programs and staff funding to allow Monroe County to protect surface and ground water for current and future citizens.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Monroe County Clerk is directed to send a copy of this resolution and the voting results, if approved, to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association, all Wisconsin County Boards, and to members of the State Legislature representing Monroe County and Monroe County Municipalities and Townships.

#### RE: ADVISORY REFERENDUM ON CLEAN WATER

**WHEREAS**, there are numerous indicators that the citizens of La Crosse County are concerned about groundwater and surface water issues including contamination from nitrates, PFAS, lead in drinking water, toxic algal blooms, flooding, and over pumping from high capacity wells;

**WHEREAS,** the Health and Human Service Board is directly involved in local and regional discussions focusing on surface water and groundwater issues and is statutorily charged with considering issues related to these topics; and,

WHEREAS, the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors has passed resolutions asking for the State of Wisconsin to pursue initiatives related to surface water and groundwater issues;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the La Crosse County Board of Supervisors, in legal session assembled, does hereby approve that the following question be placed on the April 5, 2022 ballot as an advisory referendum:

**Question:** Shall the State of Wisconsin establish a right to clean water to protect human health, the environment, and the diverse cultural and natural heritage of Wisconsin? YES or NO

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Corporation Counsel shall prepare an explanation of a yes or no vote to be published by the La Crosse County Clerk in accordance with statutory requirements; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that this resolution and the referendum shall be filed with the La Crosse County Clerk no later than 70 days prior to the April 5, 2021 election, at which the question will appear on the ballot; and,

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the La Crosse County Clerk is directed to send the results of the referendum to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Counties Association, all Wisconsin County Boards, and to local members of the State Legislature.

FISCAL NOTE: Approximately \$5,000 for the preparation and noticing of the referendum ballot.
