


#### **OVERVIEW**

The City of Racine experienced 241 gun-related arrests by the end of September 2022, slightly more than the same time in 2021.




#### GUN ARRESTS BY CRIME

### LAW ENFORCEMENT

The City of Racine Police Department and Racine County Sheriff's Office collaboratively recovered **56 guns** in 2022.

The following highlights current efforts to guide and mentor, provide real-world work experience to, and divert youth from juvenile justice.

### CREDIBLE MESSENGERS

Credible Messengers are neighborhood leaders with relevant life experience who help young people transform behaviors around violence. Additionally, school-based community connectors serve as bridges to services for students.

#### **Court Advocacy and Support**

Attend court hearings, connect participants to resources, and provide crisis assistance.



#### **Crisis Intervention**

Mediate parent/child conflicts to avoid law enforcement contact.



#### **Interactive Journaling**

Provide strategies to change, act on, and maintain positive behavior.



#### **Positive Youth Development**

Serve as a positive role model to help youth avoid adult corrections.

#### **SUMMER YOUTH JOBS**

At-risk youth participants in 2022

Racine County provided paid employment to 100+ youth across 30+ work sites during summer 2022. Youth received transportation and work supplies, learned directly from a mentor, and gained real-world work experience.
