










Calls for shots fired by City of Racine census tracts, January 1 to September 30, 2022


LAW ENFORCEMENT ARM, VCRI




BY YEAR

Gun-related cases increased by 122 cases or 71% between 2018 and 2021 in the City of Racine




GUN ARRESTS BY CRIME

POPULATION BY RACE AND ETHNICITY


People of color make up a slight majority for the first time in the City of Racine.





The Racine County District Attorney's Office saw almost 1,200 defendants in gunrelated cases between 2018 and the end of September 2022 in the City of Racine.












Below breaks down victims of gun-related crimes by age and race/ethnicity between 2018 and end of September 2022 in the City of Racine.









