Some discussion included the history of the area and the peoples who lived here. Christopher Columbus is not considered a hero to indigenous people, but as a conqueror instead.

**5. Presentation, discussion, and possible recommendation regarding the renaming of a portion of Christopher Columbus Causeway to Kipikawi Causeway in the City of Racine.**

Julie Anderson introduced this item and explained it is being brought back to the board as it was tabled earlier. Staff was concerned how this name change would impact businesses on the causeway. She read a communication from the general manager of the marina who indicated that the estimated cost for their business would be over \$20,000 because all their marketing was completed and has gone to print for the 2023 boating season. This includes full size print ads at the upcoming boat shows, print ads within boating magazines, double-sided sales flyers and tri-fold sales brochures would have to be updated and reprinted. All digital marketing outlets, including websites, social media, banner ads, etc., would have to be updated as well. The Brewhouse would need to do the same. The estimated cost for both businesses would be over \$30,000.

Supervisor Grove received a communication from the Reefpoint Brewhouse in opposition to the name change due to the cost.

**Supervisor ERIC HOPKINS moved**, seconded by **Supervisor Malacara**, to send recommendation to the County Board to change the name of the causeway to Kipikawa effective in 2024. A draft would be prepared of the name change to be presented to the committee in January 2023 and be approved by the committee before forwarding to the full County Board.

Alex Valley presented information on the speed study on CTH X. A small section of this highway is currently at 45 miles per hour while other sections on either side are at 35 miles per hour, which is why the speed study was done. The data does not support reducing the speed limit.

Supervisor Robert Miller invited the committee members to go look at this section of the highway. The Village of Somers changed their section of the highway in 2021 from 45 to 35 miles per hour due to the number of accidents.

Supervisors Grove and Chart agree with the idea of making the speed limit uniform.

Alex Valley presented this item and discussed the 5-year plan and projects approved for 2023. He also discussed some of the cost savings by doing some parts of the projects inhouse. The PASER ratings are done every other year and submitted to the DOT.

The intersection of CTHs K and V was discussed as a continuing problem intersection. A safety study was done and roundabouts were installed in the higher crash related areas. The intersection of CTHs K and V will be at the top of the list in the next couple of years for State and Federal funding. The County was unable to fund this project partly due to the estimated cost of real estate that will need to be acquired.

# Cliffside Park Coastal Wetland Restoration

*creating exceptional habitat for migratory birds, amphibians & pollinators*

## *the preservation problem*

With less than 10% of the wetlands in the Wind Point watershed remaining, “potentially restorable wetlands” within Cliffside Park are one of the last areas available of hope for sustaining coastal endangered species. Currently, the Cliffside Park has no remnant open water wetlands due to drain tiles installed for farming practices beginning in the mid 1800’s. Migratory birds rely on these open water wetland “stopovers” for food, rest and mating. Without their basic needs at these stopovers, endangered birds and waterfowl are further stressed and strained, which perpetuates their decline.

Open water wetlands and diverse native vegetation will recreate ideal habitat for these endangered species:



## *the project plan*

The Cliffside Park wetland and upland restoration project addresses the need to open up about five acres of “highly critical” wetlands, known as “#ID22” in the EPA/DNR-approved Nine-Key Element Wind Point Watershed Restoration Plan (2017). Areas within the fallow farmland of Cliffside Park, once used to grow hops for the Milwaukee breweries, will be brought back to fully functional open water wetlands and native vegetation. Wetland “scrapes” are dug out areas, up to three feet in depth, to hold water and recreate a pre-settlement wetland ecosystem.

- Goals for this wetland & prairie restoration include:
- 1 – Removal and Replace Invasive Vegetation
  - 2 – Recreation and Enhancement of Coastal Wetlands
  - 3 – Improvement of Water Quality to Lake Michigan
  - 4 – Increased Public Awareness of Coastal Wetlands
  - 5 – More Opportunities for Community Interaction

Funded by the U.S Fish and Wildlife Service and managed by Root-Pike Watershed Initiative Network, the project will also enhance diverse native vegetation in the upland areas to support endangered species. Waterfowl, amphibians and pollinators will prosper!

9 To the Honorable members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

11 **WHEREAS**, Racine County presently has approximately 168.9 miles of public  
12 snowmobile trail;

13  
14 **WHEREAS**, Racine County is interested in continuing to maintain, acquire,  
15 insure, or develop lands for public outdoor recreational purposes, such as snowmobile  
16 trail use as described in the application;

17  
18 **WHEREAS**, said public snowmobile trails are eligible for funding under Section  
19 23.09(26) of the Wisconsin State Statutes through the Wisconsin Department of Natural  
20 Resources Outdoor Motorized Recreation Trail Aids – County Snowmobile Trail Aids  
21 Program;

22  
23 **WHEREAS**, the maintenance, acquisition, insurance, and development of lands  
24 for public snowmobile trail use is consistent with the *Comprehensive Snowmobile Trail*  
25 *Plan for Racine County, A Park and Open Space Plan for Racine County, and A Multi-*  
26 *Jurisdictional Comprehensive Plan for Racine County: 2035*;

28 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of  
29 Supervisors that Racine County, through the Public Works and Development Services  
30 Department, apply for funds under Section 23.09(26) for such eligible maintenance,  
31 acquisition, insurance and/or development costs and hereby authorizes the Director of  
32 Public Works and Development Services of Racine County to: act on behalf of Racine  
33 County to submit applications to the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural  
34 Resources for any financial aid that may be available; to submit reimbursement claims  
35 along with necessary supporting documentation within six months of project completion  
36 date; and to sign and submit documents and to take necessary action to undertake,  
37 direct, and complete approved projects.

39 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that  
40 the transfer of funds within the Parks 2023 Budget, as set forth in Exhibit "A" that is  
41 attached hereto is authorized and approved.

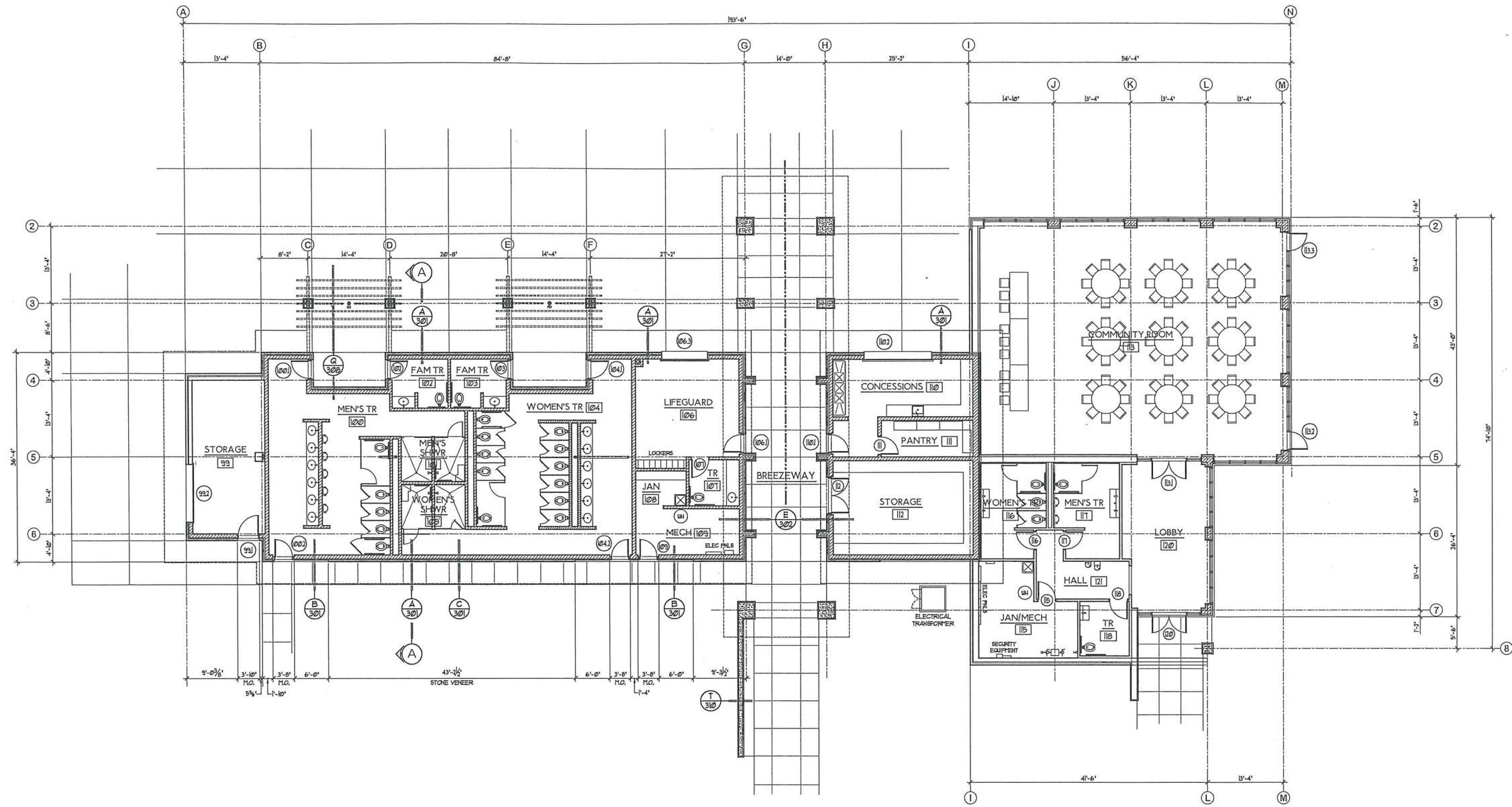

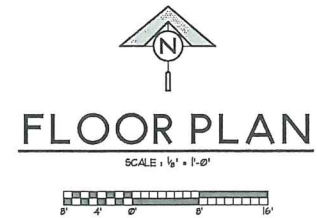
