**WHEREAS**, Ms. Alyssa Schukar, a photojournalist, was working freelance for the New York Times covering the Kenosha protests over the shooting of Jacob Blake and was taking photos of protestors and various law enforcement agencies present who were stationed outside the Kenosha County Courthouse; and

**WHEREAS,** on the evening of August 25, 2020, numerous rubber bullets were fired by unknown law enforcement agents and officers; and

**WHEREAS,** a rubber bullet hit Ms. Schukar in her left hand and she required surgery on that hand and still is undergoing physical therapy; and

**WHEREAS,** Ms. Schukar alleges given her location in a credentialed area at the time of the incident she was not a protestor and was intentionally targeted as a member of the press; and

**WHEREAS**, the Office of Corporation Counsel and the Racine County Sheriff's Office have investigated this claim and recommend denial.
