#### **Dennis Yarber**

Racine County Circuit Court Case No: 2014-CI-02

On January 9, 2023, Committee report identifying an appropriate Adult Family Home (AFH) for Mr. Yarber was provided to DHS with copies provided to parties and filed with the court in Mr. Yarber's commitment case. Committee's identified placement was approved by the court on February 10, 2023, and DHS confirmed that Mr. Yarber will be placed at the AFH within the appropriate statutory time periods.

#### James Levandowski

Racine County Circuit Court Case No: 2013-CI-01

Committee continues to search for an appropriate residential option. The Committee on November 4, 2022, sent a report to the Court describing the efforts that the Committee has made in its attempts to locate a residential option for Mr. Levandowski.

#### Waukesha County Circuit Court Case No:2004CI01

A petition to revoke order for supervised release was filed on December 7, 2022. A motion hearing is scheduled for March 9, 2023.

#### James Hinkle

#### Racine County Circuit Court Case No: 2012CI01

On December 21, 2022, a motion was made by Mr. Hinkle to return to the community, but that motion was withdrawn at the court hearing held on January 30, 2023. Mr. Hinkle will therefore remain at Sandridge Secure Treatment Facility ("Sandridge") at this time. Another review hearing was set for March 16, 2023 in Mr. Hinkle's case to address which rules Mr. Hinkle is required to follow while at Sandridge.

#### **Danial R. Williams**

## Racine County Circuit Court Case No: 1995CF1197

Mr. Williams has returned to Sandridge pursuant to an Alternative to Revocation ("ATR") agreed upon by the parties in Mr. Williams' commitment case on January 30, 2023; however, the Court has ordered that his residence in Racine County should be maintained. The residence at which Mr. Williams' is placed does not meet the statutory requirements for a serious child sex offender, so this residence cannot be identified by the Committee for any outstanding Chapter 980 offenders requiring placement at this time. Mr. Williams still has a pending motion to dismiss, but the Court has reserved any ruling on that motion for the time being. A review hearing is scheduled before the Court on July 7, 2023.

## 6. <u>Discuss-consider process for making recommendation to DHS and Court for Chapter 980 sex</u> offender placement

Principal Assistant Corporation Counsel John P. Serketich reported that he participated in the state-wide zoom meeting of corporation counsels regarding Chapter 980 issues in January but could not participate in the meeting in February. There is still the pending Wisconsin Court of Appeals case involving Kenosha County being ordered to buy or build a placement with the State being responsible for the construction funding. It is expected that a possible decision could come from the Appeals Court this spring or summer. The Eastern District Court case concerning a couple from

Kenosha and one from Racine, who has since been released, is also still pending. Corporation Counsel will continue to monitor these cases.
