

Presenter Bios:

Bob Buege, a retired educator, is the founder of the Ken Keltner Badger State Chapter of the Society for American Baseball Research (SABR). He is also the president of the Milwaukee Braves Historical Association.

A prolific researcher and a terrific writer, Buege is a mentor to many of the chapters members and is highly respected by the organization. Bob has published four books, three which are baseball related. He wrote what is recognized as the resource that captured the Milwaukee Braves used by all researchers when writing about the team, *The Milwaukee Braves A Baseball Eulogy*. He wrote the autobiography of his favorite player, *Eddie Mathews and the National Pastime*. And Buege penned the history of the ballpark before County Stadium, *Borchert Field Stories from Milwaukee's Legendary Ballpark*; filled with stories and history of Milwaukee from the late 19th century into the middle of the 20th. Stepping outside the baseball realm for a friend, he authored the definitive historical account of Pine Bluff, Wisconsin. In addition, he has contributed articles to many SABR publications.

Dennis D. Degenhardt retired following 40-years as a credit union professional, including chief executive the final 14, to do what he wanted to be when growing up, baseball. The difference now is researching and writing instead of making the big leagues. Dennis has been an active member of the Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) since 1997 thanks to a Christmas gift from his spouse, Linda. He has been an officer in SABR's Ken Keltner Badger State Chapter since 2001, including President since 2019.

Dennis has contributed to four SABR Bio-books, From the Braves to the Brewers Great Games and Exciting History at Milwaukee's County Stadium, Harvey's Wallbangers: The 1982 Milwaukee Brewers, Bittersweet Goodbye: The Black Barons, the Grays, and the 1948 Negro League World Series, and the recently published, One Win Wonders. He publishes the chapter's monthly newsletter, the Keltner Hot Corner. Dennis and Linda have four children, six grandkids, and one great-grandson.

Rick Schabowski is a retired machinist from Harley-Davidson who is currently teaching for the Wisconsin Regional Training Partnership and Waukesha County Technical College. He is also President of the Wisconsin Old Time Ballplayers Association, President Emeritus of the Ken Keltner Badger State Chapter of the Society of American Baseball Research (SABR), Treasurer of the Milwaukee Braves Historical Association, and a member of the Hoop Historians.

He has written a book, "From Coin Toss to Championship 1971: The Year of the Milwaukee Bucks." He has also contributed to several book projects for SABR including Thar's Joy in Braveland! The 1957 Milwaukee Braves, From the Braves to the Brewers Great Games and Exciting History at Milwaukee's County Stadium, and Harvey's Wallbangers: The 1982 Milwaukee Brewers. He has also contributed to the Pro Football Researchers Association. He and his wife Debbie live in St. Francis, Wisconsin.
