"KR", AND STATE TRUNK HIGHWAY (S.T.H.) "75",

**BE IT RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that a Memorandum of Understanding between Racine County, Kenosha County and the Department of Transportation, which is attached here as "Exhibit A" and incorporated by reference, for the jurisdictional transfer of portions of CTH "KR" and portions of STH 75, located in Racine County, Wisconsin, is authorized and approved; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the jurisdictional transfer as set forth herein is contingent on Kenosha County, and the WisDOT review and approval of the jurisdictional transfer.

 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that any two of the County Clerk, the County Executive, and/or the County Board Chairman are authorized to execute any leases, contracts, agreements, amendments, or other documents necessary to carry out the intent of this resolution.

Memorandum of Understanding
between
Kenosha County
and
Racine County
and
Wisconsin Department of Transportation

This memorandum defines the agreement between Kenosha County, Racine County, and the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT), collectively the parties ("Parties"), for a Jurisdictional and State Highway Change of CTH KR and WIS 75 as further described.

WHEREAS, Section 84.02(8), Wisconsin Statutes, enables WisDOT to enter into jurisdictional transfer agreements with local units of government, thereby facilitating alterations in jurisdictional highway systems; and,

WHEREAS, Vision 2050 Recommended Regional Land Use and Transportation Plan prepared by the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission recommends WIS 75 become a County Trunk Highway; and,

WHEREAS, WIS 75 was originally constructed to serve Bong Air Force Base which was never constructed; and,

WHEREAS, County Highway KR was reconstructed to accommodate anticipated development.

## RECITALS

- A. On November 13, 2008, Racine County and the State entered into a Jurisdictional Transfer Agreement (JT261) giving jurisdiction to WisDOT for the northern portion of CTH KR 1,685 feet west of I-94 Centerline to 1,098 feet east of the I94 centerline; and intend to preserve this as State jurisdiction; and,
  - a. All terms are satisfied.
- B. On March 30, 2009, Kenosha County and WisDOT entered into a Jurisdictional Transfer Agreement (JT278) giving Jurisdiction to the State for the southern portion of CTH KR 500 feet west of the relocated I-94 West Frontage Road to 500 feet east of the relocated I94 East Frontage Road; and Intend to preserve this as State Jurisdiction; and,
  - a. All terms are satisfied.
- C. On October 30, 2017, Village of Mount Pleasant, Racine County, and WisDOT, entered into an agreement committing to a jurisdictional transfer giving jurisdiction to the State for CTH KR the West 194 Frontage Road to 90<sup>th</sup> Street as well as commitments related to the reconstruction of the highway; and,
  - a. Term B.7. requires a payment from Racine County of up to [\$11,500,000], if TID #5 in the Village of Mount Pleasant closes prior to 2043. This term is still in effect.
- D. On November 2, 2017, Racine County and the State entered into a Jurisdictional Transfer Agreement giving Jurisdiction to the State for CTH KR between the West 194 Frontage Road and 90th St.; and,
  - a. Terms errantly duplicate transferring CTH KR to the State between the West 194 Frontage Road and 500 feet east of the East 194 Frontage Road.
  - b. Agreement was not fully executed, lacking Kenosha County signature.
- E. On April 16, 2018, Kenosha County, Racine County, and the State entered into a Jurisdictional Transfer Agreement (JTA#FC-03) giving jurisdiction to the State for CTH KR between the West 194 Frontage Road and Old Green Bay Road; and

- a. Terms errantly duplicate transferring CTH KR to the State between the West 194 Frontage Road and 500 feet east of the East 194 Frontage Road.
- b. Terms specify Racine County payment for construction of CTH KR segment between Wis 31 and Old Green Bay Road.
- c. Terms specify the development of a long-range access management vision of the corridor which is provided by the design plan.
- d. Terms specify that the Department shall be responsible for lane mileage recalculation and an agreement prior to transferring jurisdiction.
- e. Terms specify that upon execution of an operations and maintenance agreement between the countles and the Village, continuous street lighting would be designed and constructed; the agreement dated November 11, 2020 was signed by Racine County but never fully executed and continuous street lighting was installed.
- F. Kenosha County and WisDOT signed Traffic Control Signal Operation and Maintenance Agreements between for the following:
  - a. Kenosha County, CTH KR and CTH H, June 4, 2018
  - b. Kenosha County, CTH KR and 100th Street / Foxconn Driveway, June 4, 2018; and

## Now, Therefore, the Parties agree to all of the following:

- 1. WisDOT will return and Kenosha and Racine Counties will accept jurisdiction of CTH KR between 500 feet east of the East 194 Frontage Road to Old Green Bay Road to satisfy prior agreements; and,
- 2. WisDOT and Kenosha and Racine Countles will swap jurisdiction of the following highways in their current condition without payment after the completion and acceptance of the State's Highway Safety Improvement Project at the intersection of Wis 75 and CTH A (2420-00-70) scheduled for 2024; and,
  - a. Jurisdictional Transfer of Wis 75 from Wis 50 (excluding the intersection) to Kenosha / Racine County Line to Kenosha County; and,
  - b. Jurisdictional Transfer of Wis 75 from Kenosha / Racine County Line to Wis 20 (excluding the Intersections with Wis 11 and Wis 20) to Racine County; and,
  - c. Jurisdictional Transfer and State Highway Designation of CTH KR from 500 feet east of the East 194 Frontage Road to Wis 32 to the State; and
- 3. Racine County, or their designee, will remove continuous highway lighting (poles, arms, lights, wires) identified in Attachment A and referenced in E.e. above and return that equipment to the State at their designated location at County cost; and,
- 4. The Parties will revise signal agreements to indicate WisDOT operation and maintenance of Traffic Control Signals on CTH KR.
