1. Call to Order, Roll Call

4. Review, discussion, and possible recommendation on a resolution for delegation of review and approval authority for highway functional classification updates

Nathan Plunkett presented the proposed resolution and provided background information. It was explained that the map is updated by WisDOT every ten years based on census and traffic data. The map changes may also add additional areas to the urban area (as defined by WisDOT) and sometimes small segments of highway have classification changes based on how they function. Discussion followed. The resolution would give the authority of approval for the updated highway functional classification maps to the County Highway Commissioner with notification going to the Public Works, Parks and Facilities Committee.

SUPERVISOR ROVERT GROVE MOVED, seconded by Supervisor David Cooke, to direct staff to prepare a resolution and to forward the resolution to the County Board, with a recommendation to approve.

5. Review, discussion, and possible recommendation for sidewalk installation on the north side of Spring Street (CTH "C"), west of STH 31, in the Village of Mt. Pleasant

Director Julie Anderson and Nathan Plunkett presented the request. The Village of Mt Pleasant requires sidewalks, and the sidewalk policy for Racine County requires review and approval of all sidewalks along County Trunk Highways. The proposed sidewalk under discussion this evening will serve the new Kwik Trip gas station/ convenience store which is being built just west of STH 31, along the north side of CTH "C" (Spring Street). Discussion followed. The approval letter from Racine County will stipulate that the property owner is responsible for maintenance of the sidewalk, in perpetuity, even if the county highway is widened and the sidewalk is then within the county highway right of way. This is also consistent with the policy in place for sidewalks.

SUPERVISOR DAVID COOKE MOVED, seconded by Supervisor Scott Maier, to approve the sidewalk installation as presented.
