ORDINANCE BY THE GOVERNMENT SERVICES COMMITTEE AMENDING VARIOUS SECTIONS IN CHAPTER 4 OF THE RACINE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATING TO **COLLECTION OF DOG LICENSE TAXES AND TO HUMANE OFFICERS**

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

The Racine County Board of Supervisors does ordain as follows:

Part 1

Section 4-36 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances, relating to the amount of county taxes for dogs, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4-36. - Amount of tax.

A four dollar (\$4.00) annual license tax on every altered dog and an eight dollar (\$8.00) annual license tax on every unaltered dog, over five (5) months of age, in the county is hereby enacted in accord with W.S.A., ch. 174. It must be noted to the county clerk by the clerk of the municipality, or his the clerk's duly authorized agent, whether the licensed dog is male, female or altered.

Part 2

Section 4-38 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances, relating to fees charged by the County Clerk for processing of dog licenses, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4-38. - Clerk's fee. Reporting and payment of dog license taxes.

- (a) On or before December 31 of each year, t∓he clerk of each municipality collecting the dog license tax shall pay to the county treasurer the total amount of dog license taxes collected during that year, less any additional tax that may have been levied by the municipal governing body, and less receive a fee of twenty-five cents (\$0.25) for each dog listed.
- (b) At the same time as payment of dog license taxes is made to the county treasurer, the clerk of the municipality shall report in writing to the county clerk the licenses issued, on a form furnished by the county clerk.
- (c) The dog license taxes so paid to the county treasurer shall be kept in a separate account and shall be known as the "dog license fund." Within 30 days after receipt of the dog license taxes, the county treasurer shall pay into the state treasury, from the dog license fund, five (5) percent of the minimum tax as provided for under section 174.05 (2), W.S.A., for all dog licenses issued by all county municipalities.
- (d) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), above, the county clerk may establish policies and procedures to accomplish any of the following:
 - (1) Provide for submission by the clerks of the issuing municipalities periodic, as well as year-end, reports of licenses issued;
 - (2) Permit municipalities to pay dog license taxes to the county later than December 31, but not later than February 20 of the following year; and
 - (3) If the county clerk is able to estimate the expenses payable under section 4-39, below, permit municipalities to pay to the county such lesser sums as the county clerk deems sufficient to meet all anticipated expenses, in proportion to the number and value of the licenses issued by the various municipalities.

Part 3

Section 4-39 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances, relating to application of the county dog license fund, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4-39. –Application of <u>dog license</u> fund.

Monies in the dog license fund shall be appropriated and disbursed for The county clerk shall pay over to the county for its use in the support of a pound for stray or unwanted dogs all sums remaining in the dog license fund on December thirty-first of each year, after the payment of the following expenses:

- (1) Five (5) percent of the net statutory fee remitted <u>for all licenses issued</u> by the municipalities to the county shall be paid to the treasurer of the state, as provided for in section 4-38(c), above.
- (2) Necessary expenses incurred **by the county** in the administration of the dog license law.
- (3) Payment of claims to owners of domestic animals for damages done by stray dogs.
- (4) **Retention of t**The sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) shall be retained by the county clerk for claims for the next calendar year.

If, after payment of all of the foregoing expenses, any amount remains in the dog license fund, such amount shall be paid to the various municipalities, in proportion to the number and value of the licenses issued by each of them.

Part 4

Section 4-80 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances, relating to duties and powers of humane officers, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4-80. - Duties and powers of humane officers.

Humane officers in appointed by Racine County shall have the powers and duties set forth in W.S.A. § 173.07.

Part 5

Section 4-81 of the Racine County Code of Ordinances, relating to appointment of humane officers, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4-81. - Appointment of humane officers.

The Racine County Board of Supervisors shall county executive may appoint up to four (4) humane officers for Racine County, with the approval of. These appointments shall be made at the recommendation of the county executive who shall secure recommendations of any humane society existing within the county prior to submitting his or her recommendations to the Racine County Board of Supervisors. Said humane officers shall serve a two (2) year terms. Any humane officers who have been appointed prior to the effective date of this article shall have their position as humane officer terminated. The Racine County Board of Supervisors county executive shall report all appointments and terminations of humane officers to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. All humane officers appointed by the Racine County Board of Supervisors shall have the proper certification as defined by W.S.A. § 173.05. Failure of a humane officer to obtain proper certification within the time periods required by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection shall be grounds for termination of the appointment.
