ORDINANCE BY THE RACINE COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND LAND USE PLANNING COMMITTEE AMENDING OF CHAPTER 12.5, NONMETALLIC MINING RECLAMATION, RACINE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

The Racine County Board of Supervisors ordains as follows: Amend to read as follows:

AMEND SEC. 12.5-7(a) as follows:

(a) Overall applicability. The requirements of this chapter apply to all operators of nonmetallic mining sites within the County of Racine, operating on or commencing to operate after August 1, 2001 except as exempted in sSec. 2112.5-7(b) and for nonmetallic mining sites located in a city, village or town within the County of Racine that has adopted an ordinance pursuant to W.S.A. § 295.14, and Section NR 135.32(2), Wisconsin Administrative Code. This chapter does not apply to nonmetallic mining sites where nonmetallic mining permanently ceases ceased before August 1, 2001. This chapter applies to nonmetallic mining conducted by or on behalf of the State of Wisconsin, by or on behalf of a municipality a county, municipality, or for the benefit or use of the state or any state agency, board, commission or department, except that the for the waiver of financial assurance requirements of in section 21-14(d) 12.5-43 do not apply.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-7 (b) (7) as follows:

 (7) Nonmetallic mining at nonmetallic mining sites that affects when less than one acre of total affected acreage occurs area over the life of the mine.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-9. Effective date as follows:

The provisions of this chapter shall take effect on June 1, 2001 upon publication.

AMEND Sec. 12.5-10. Definitions as follows:

Highwall means a vertical or nearly vertical face in solid

Add the following definitions in their proper alphabetical order:

rock or a slope of consolidated or unconsolidated material that exceeds a slope of 3:1.

Licensed professional geologist means a person who is licensed as a professional geologist pursuant to W.S.A. §§470.

Person means an individual, owner, operator, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, association, county, municipality, interstate agency, state agency or federal agency.

AMEND the following definitions as follows:

Applicable reclamation ordinance means a nonmetallic mining reclamation ordinance, including this chapter, that applies to a particular nonmetallic mining site and complies  $\mathtt{with}$ requirements of this Chapter NR 135, Wisconsin Administrative Code and subchapter I of Ch. 295, W.S.A., unless the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is the regulatory authority as defined herein in subsection (20) (b) 3. If the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is the regulatory authority, "applicable reclamation ordinance" means the relevant and applicable provisions of Chapter NR 135, Wisconsin Administrative Code.

Registered professional engineer means a person who is registered as a professional engineer pursuant to W.S.A. §§ 443.04 and 443.09.

Regulatory authority means one of the following:

- County of Racine for nonmetallic mine sites located within (1) its jurisdiction, or
- A municipality in which the nonmetallic mining site is located and which has adopted an applicable reclamation ordinance,
- the county in which the nonmetallic mining site is b. located, if no reclamation municipal ordinance exists pursuant to subsection a., provided the county has an applicable reclamation ordinance, or
- the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, in cases where a county mining reclamation program is no longer  $\overline{\text{in}}$ effect under W.S.A. §§ 295.14, but only if there is no applicable reclamation ordinance enacted by the municipality or the county in which the nonmetallic mining site is located.

AMEND Sec. 12.5-26(d)(1) as follows:

- (d) Topsoil management.
- Removal. Topsoil and topsoil substitute material shall be provided removed, protected and redistributed to support reclamation and site stabilization. as specified in the reclamation plan approved pursuant to this chapter in order to achieve reclamation to the approved post-mining land use. Removal of onsite Ttopsoil and topsoil substitute material removal, when submitted in the reclamation plan, shall be performed, as required by the reclamation plan, prior to any mining activity associated with any specific phase of the mining operation.

REPEAL & RE-CREATE SEC. 12-5-26(e) to read as follows:

49 50 (e) Final grading and slopes.

- (1) All areas affected by mining shall be addressed in the approved reclamation plan, pursuant to this chapter, to provide a stable and safe condition consistent with the postmining land use is achieved. The reclamation plan may designate highwalls or other un-mined and undisturbed natural solid bedrock as stable and safe and not in need of reclamation, or designate other areas affected by mining, including slopes comprised of unconsolidated materials that exceed a 3:1 slope, whether or not graded, as stable and safe. For slopes designated as stable under this subsection, the regulatory authority may require that either: a sitespecific engineering analysis be performed by a registered professional engineer to demonstrate that an acceptable slope stability factor is attainable at a steeper slope, or the operator perform a field test plot demonstration, demonstrate that a stable and safe condition will be achieved that the post-mining land use specified reclamation plan will not be adversely affected.
- (2) Final reclaimed slopes covered by topsoil or topsoil substitute material may not be steeper than a 3:1 horizontal to vertical incline, unless found acceptable through one or more of the following: alternative requirements are approved under Sec. 12.5-47; steeper slopes are shown to be stable through a field plot demonstration approved as part of an approved reclamation plan; or stable slopes can demonstrated based on site-specific engineering analysis performed by a registered professional engineer. All areas in the nonmetallic mine site where topsoil or topsoil substitute material is to be reapplied shall be graded or otherwise prepared prior to topsoil or topsoil substitute material redistribution to provide optimum adherence between the topsoil or topsoil substitute material and the underlying material.
- (3) When the approved post-mining land use includes a body of water, the approved final grade at the edge of a body of water shall extend vertically six (6) feet below the lowest seasonal water level. A slope no steeper than 3:1 shall be created at a designated location or locations, depending on the size of the water body to allow for a safe exit.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-41. Nonmetallic mining reclamation permit application as follows:

Sec. 12.5-41. Nonmetallic mining reclamation permit application.

- (a) Nonmetallic mining reclamation permit is required. person may engage in nonmetallic mining or in nonmetallic mining reclamation without possessing a nonmetallic mining reclamation permit issued pursuant to this chapter, unless the activity is specifically exempted in Sec. 12.5-7 or Sec. 12-5-10.
- (a) (b) Required submittal. All operators of nonmetallic mining sites that operate on or after August 1, 2001 shall apply for a reclamation permit from the County of Racine. All applications for reclamation permits under this section shall be accompanied by the following information:
  - (1) A brief description of the general location and nature of the nonmetallic mine.
  - legal description of the property on which (2) A the nonmetallic mine is located or proposed, including the parcel identification number.
  - (3) The names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all persons or organizations who are owners or lessors of the property on which the nonmetallic mining site is located.
  - (4) The name, address, and telephone number of the person or organization who is the operator.
  - (5) A certification by the operator of his or her intent to comply with the statewide nonmetallic mining reclamation standards established by article II.
  - (6) Any other materials the planning and development department may reasonably require.
- (b) Existing mines. The operator of any existing nonmetallic mining site in operation on August 1, 2001 may apply for an automatic reclamation permit from the County of Racine by providing the information set forth below no later than on August 1, 2001 to the Racine County Planning and Development Department.
  - (1) The information required by subsection 12.5-41(a).
  - (2) The first year's annual fee, as required by section 12.5-<del>70.</del>
  - (3) A certification signed by the operator that he or she will provide the County of Racine with a complete reclamation plan required by section 12.5-42 and financial assurance required by section 12.5-43 no later than the times established pursuant to this chapter.

(2) (1) Site Information. The reclamation plan shall include 51 information sufficient to describe the existing natural 52 and physical conditions of the site, including, but not 53 limited to:

- New mines Reclamation permit application contents. operator of any nonmetallic mine site that engages in or plans to engage in nonmetallic mining that will begin operations after August 1, 2001 or which has not applied for an automatic reclamation permit pursuant to subsection 12.5-41(b) shall submit an application that meets the requirements specified below to Racine County Planning and Development Department prior beginning operations. This application shall be accompanied by a plan review fee as specified in section 12.5-69.
  - The information required by subsection 12.5-41(a). (1)
  - (2) The plan review and annual fees required by sections 12.5-69 and 12.5-70.
  - A reclamation plan conforming to section 12.5-42. (3)
  - A certification that the operator will provide, as a (4)condition of the reclamation permit, provide financial assurance as required by section 12.5-43 upon granting of the reclamation permit and before mining begins.
  - (5) To avoid duplication, the permit application submittals required under this subsection may, reference, incorporate existing plans or materials that meet the requirements of this chapter.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-42(a)(1), (2) & (3) as follows:

Sec. 12.5-42. Reclamation Plan.

- Reclamation plan requiredments. All operators conduct or plan to conduct nonmetallic mining of nonmetallic mining sites subject to this chapter shall prepare and submit to the Racine County Planning and Development Department a reclamation plan that meets the following requirements and the reclamation standards of Article II.
  - (1) Plan required. An operator who conducts or plans to conduct nonmetallic mining on or after August 1, 2001 shall submit to the County of Racine a reclamation plan that meets the requirements of this section and complies with the standards of article II. To avoid duplication, the reclamation plan may, by reference, incorporate existing plans or materials that meet the requirements of this chapter.

- a. Maps of the nonmetallic mining site including the general location, property boundaries, the aerial extent, geologic composition and depth of the nonmetallic mineral deposit, the distribution, thickness and type of topsoil, the location of surface waters and the existing drainage pattern, the approximate elevation of ground water, as determined by existing hydrogeologic information, specific instances where hydrogeologic information is insufficient for purposes of the reclamation plan, the applicant may supplement the information with the opinion a licensed professional geologist of hydrologist. The location of surface waters and the existing drainage patterns.
- b. Topsoil or topsoil substitute material required to support revegetation needed for reclaiming the site to the approved post-mining land use can be identified using Racine County soil surveys or other available information, including that obtained from a soil scientist or the University of Wisconsin soil science extension agent or other available information resources.
- b.c. Information available to the mine operator on biological resources, plant communities, and wildlife use at and adjacent to the proposed or operating mine sites.
- e.d. Existing topography as shown on contour maps of the site at two-foot (2') contour intervals.
- d.e. Location of manmade features on or near the site.
- e.f. For existing mines proposed nonmetallic mining sites that include previously mined areas, a plan view drawing showing the location and extent of land previously affected by nonmetallic mining, including the location of stockpiles, wash ponds and sediment basins.

(2) <del>(3)</del> Post-mining land use.

a. The reclamation plan shall specify a proposed post-mining land use for the nonmetallic mine site. The proposed post-mining land use shall be consistent with local land use plans, comprehensive plans and local zoning at the time the plan is submitted, unless a change to the land use plan or zoning is proposed. The proposed post-mining land use shall also be consistent with all applicable local, state, or federal laws in effect at the time the plan is submitted.

b. Land used for nonmetallic mineral extraction in areas zoned under an exclusive agricultural use ordinance pursuant to W.S.A. § 91.75, shall be restored to agricultural use.

RENUMBER SEC. 12-42(a)(4), (5)&(6)as(3), (4)&(5) respectively.

AMEND RENUMBERED SEC. 12-5-42(a)(3)a. as follows:

a. A description of the proposed earthwork and reclamation, including final slope angles, high wall reduction, benching, terracing and other structural slope stabilization measures, and, if necessary, a site-specific engineering analysis performed by a registered professional engineer, as provided by Sec. 12.5-26(e)(1) and (2).

CREATE SEC. 12.5-42(a)(3)j. as follows:

j.A description of how the reclamation plan addresses the longterm safety of the reclaimed mining site. The description shall include a discussion of site-specific safety measures to be implemented at the site and include measures that address public safety with regard to adjacent land uses.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-42(a)(4) as follows:

(5) (4) Criteria for successful reclamation.

The reclamation plan shall contain criteria for assuring successful reclamation in accordance with subsection 12.5-26(h).

AMEND SEC. 12.5-42(a)(5) as follows:

(6) (5) Certification of reclamation plan.

- a. The operator shall provide a signed certification that reclamation will be carried out in accordance with the reclamation plan. If the operator does not own the land, The landowner and lessee or lessor, if different from the operator, shall also provide signed certification that they concur with the reclamation plan and will allow its implementation. , except as provided in subsection b.
- b. For the following situations, the landowner and lessee, if different from the mine operator, are not required to submit a written certification in accordance with subsection a. The operator shall provide written evidence that the landowner and lessee, if different from the operator, have been provided with a written copy of the reclamation plan, and that:
- 1. The mine operator has submitted a reclamation plan for an existing mine in accordance with subsection 12.5-41(b), or
- 2. The operator has submitted a reclamation plan for a new or reopened mine in accordance subsection 12.5-41(c) which is located on land for which a lease agreement or memorandum of lease between the landowner and applicant was recorded prior August 1, 2001.
- (7) Approval. The operator shall keep a copy of the reclamation plan required by this section, once approved by the County of Racine under this chapter, at the mine site or, if not practicable, at the operator's nearest office or place of business.
- (b) Existing mines. The operator of any nonmetallic mining site that submits an automatic permit application in conformance with subsection 12.5-41(b) shall submit the reclamation plan required by subsection 12.5-42(a) by August 1, 2002.
- (c) New mines. The operator of any nonmetallic mining site not in operation prior to August 1, 2001 that applies for a permit in conformance with subsection 12.5-41(c) shall submit the reclamation plan required by subsection 12.5-42(a) with its application for a reclamation permit.
- (d) (b) Existing plans and approvals. To avoid duplication of effort, the reclamation plan required by subsection 12.5-42(a) may, by reference, incorporate existing plans or materials that meet the requirements of this chapter. Previous approvals for nonmetallic mining sites in operation on

August 1, 2001 shall satisfy the requirements of subsection 12.5-42(a) if they meet the following requirements:

- (1) The document has been approved by a county or municipality; and
- (2) The planning and development committee finds that the document designates a post-mining land use and describes reclamation measures that meet the reclamation standards of this chapter.
- (e) (c) Approval of reclamation plan. The planning and development committee shall approve, conditionally approve or deny the reclamation plan submitted under this section in writing in accordance with subsection 12.5-45(c)(3) for existing mines and subsection 12.5-45(d) 12.5-45(a) for mines that apply for a reclamation permit in conformance with this chapter. Conditional approvals of reclamation plans shall be made according to subsection 12.5-45(d) and denials of reclamation plans shall be made pursuant to section 12.5-46. The operator shall keep a copy of the reclamation plan approved under this subsection at the mine site or, if not practicable, at the operator's nearest place of business.

DELETE SEC. 12.5-43(b)

AMEND RENUMBERED SEC. 12.5-43(b) as follows:

RENUMBER SEC. 12.5-43(c) & (d) as (b) & (c)

- (b) (c) New Private nonmetallic mines. The operator of any nonmetallic mining site that applies for a reclamation permit in conformance with subsection 12.5-41(c) shall submit the proof of financial assurance required by subsection 12.5-43(a) as specified in the reclamation permit issued to it under this chapter.
- (c) (d) Public nonmetallic mining. The financial assurance requirements of this section do not apply to nonmetallic mining conducted by the State of Wisconsin, a state agency, board, commission or department, or a municipality.

REPEAL & RE-CREATE SEC. 12.5-44 to read as follows:

Sec. 12.5-44. Public notice and right of hearing.

(a) Reclamation plan hearing. The County of Racine shall provide public notice and the opportunity for a public informational hearing as set forth below:

(1) Public notice.

- a. When the County of Racine receives a complete nonmetallic mining reclamation permit application
  - nonmetallic mining reclamation permit application that satisfies subsection 12.5-41(c), it shall publish a public notice of the application no later than thirty (30) days after receipt.
  - b. The notice shall briefly describe the mining and reclamation planned at the nonmetallic mining site. The notice shall be published as a class 1 notice pursuant to W.S.A. § 985.07(1), in the official newspaper of the County of Racine. The notice shall mention the opportunity for public hearing pursuant to this section and shall give the locations at which the public may review the application and all supporting materials including the reclamation plan.
  - c. Copies of the notice shall be forwarded by the County of Racine to the county or applicable municipal zoning board, the county and applicable local planning organization, the county land conservation officer, and owners of land within three hundred (300) feet of the boundaries of the parcel or parcels of land on which the site is located.
- (2) Hearing. The County of Racine shall provide for an opportunity for a public informational hearing on an application or request to issue a nonmetallic mining reclamation permit as follows.
  - a. If it conducts a zoning related hearing on the nonmetallic mine site, the County of Racine shall provide the opportunity at this hearing to present testimony on reclamation-related matters. This opportunity shall fulfill the requirement for public hearing for a nonmetallic mining reclamation permit required by this section. The planning and development committee shall consider the reclamation-related testimony in the zoning-related hearing in deciding on a permit application pursuant to this chapter.
  - b. 1.If there is no opportunity for a zoning related hearing on the nonmetallic mine site as described in subsection a. above, opportunity for public hearing required by this section shall be provided as follows. Any person residing within, owning property within, or whose principal place of business is within three hundred (300) feet of the boundary of the parcel or parcels of land in which the nonmetallic mining site is located or proposed may request a public informational hearing. planning and development committee shall hold a public hearing if requested by any of these persons within 30 days of the actual date of public notice under subsection 12.5-44(a)(1). This public informational hearing shall be held no sooner than thirty (30) days nor later than sixty (60) days after being requested. The hearing shall be conducted as an informational hearing for the purpose of explaining and receiving comment fromaffected persons on the feasibility, and effects of the proposed reclamation. hearing shall be before the planning development committee of Racine County at its regularly scheduled public hearing. The procedures used for the and development committee's regularly scheduled public hearing shall apply.

- 2. The subject matter and testimony at this informational hearing shall be limited to reclamation of the nonmetallic mine site.
  - (b) Local transportation-related mines. No public notice or informational hearing is required for a nonmetallic mining reclamation permit issued to a local transportation-related mine pursuant to section 12.5-45(b).

(Ord. No. 2001-8, 5-22-01)

REPEAL & RE-CREATE SEC. 12.5-45 to read as follows:

Sec. 12.5-45. Issuance of a nonmetallic mining reclamation permit.

No person may engage in nonmetallic mining or nonmetallic mining reclamation in Racine County without first obtaining a reclamation permit issued under this section, except for nonmetallic mining sites that are exempt from this Chapter under Sec. 12.5 - 7 or Sec. 12.5-10.

- (a) Permit required. Applications for reclamation permits for nonmetallic mining sites that satisfy subsection 12.5-41(c) shall be issued a reclamation permit or otherwise acted on as provided below.
  - (1) Unless denied pursuant to sec. 12.5-46, the County of Racine shall approve in writing a request that satisfies the requirements of subsection 12.5-41(c) to issue a nonmetallic mining reclamation permit for the proposed nonmetallic mine.

- (2) The County of Racine may not issue an approval without prior or concurrent approval of the reclamation plan that meets the requirements of section 12.5-42. The regulatory authority may issue a reclamation permit subject to conditions in subsection 12.5-45(d) if appropriate. The permit decision shall be made no sooner than thirty (30) days nor later than ninety (90) days following receipt of reclamation permit application reclamation plan pursuant to this subchapter, unless a public hearing is held pursuant to section 12.5-44. If a public hearing is held, the regulatory authority shall issue the reclamation permit, subject to conditions pursuant to subsection 12.5-45(d) if appropriate, or shall deny the permit as provided in section 12.5-46, no later than sixty (60) days after completing the public hearing.
- (3) Permits issued pursuant to this subsection shall require compliance with a reclamation plan that has been approved and satisfies the requirements of section 12.5-42 and provision by the applicant of financial assurance required under section 12.5-43 and payable to the County of Racine prior to beginning mining.
- (b) Automatic permit for local transportation-related mines.
- (1) The County of Racine shall automatically issue an expedited permit under this subsection to any borrow site that:
  - a. Will be opened and reclaimed under contract with a municipality within a period not exceeding thirty-six (36) months;
  - b. Is a nonmetallic mine which is intended to provide stone, soil, sand or gravel for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance or repair of a highway, railroad, airport facility or other transportation facility under contract with the municipality;
  - c. Is regulated and will be reclaimed under contract with the municipality in accordance with the requirements of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation concerning the restoration of nonmetallic mining sites;

- d. Is not a commercial source;
- e. Will be constructed, operated and reclaimed in accordance with applicable zoning requirements, if any and;
- f. Is not otherwise exempt from the requirements of this chapter under subsection 12.5-7(b)(10).
- (2) In this subsection, "municipality" has the meaning defined in W.S.A. § 299.01(8).
- (3) Automatic permits shall be issued under this subsection in accordance with the following provisions:
  - a. The applicant shall notify the County of Racine of the terms and conditions of the contract with respect to reclamation of the proposed borrow site.
  - b. The applicant shall provide evidence to the County of Racine to show that the borrow site and its reclamation will comply with applicable zoning requirements, if any.
  - c. The County of Racine shall accept the contractual provisions incorporating requirements of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation in lieu of a reclamation plan under section 12.5-42.
  - d. The County of Racine shall accept the contractual provisions in lieu of the financial assurance requirements in section 12.5-43.
  - e. The public notice and hearing provisions of section 12.5-44 do not apply to nonmetallic mining sites that are issued automatic permits under this subsection.
  - f. Mines permitted under this subsection shall pay an annual fee to the County of Racine as provided in section 12.5-70, but shall not be subject to the plan review fee provided in section 12.5-69. The total annual fee, including the share of the Department of Natural Resources, shall not exceed the amount in Table 2, NR 135.39.
  - g. The County of Racine shall issue the automatic permit within seven (7) days of the receipt of a complete application.

- h. If the borrow site is used to concurrently supply materials for other than the local transportation project, the automatic permitting in this subsection still applies provided the site will be reclaimed under a contractual obligation with the municipality in accordance with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation requirements.
- i. Notwithstanding section 12.5-68, the operator of a borrow site under this subsection is required to submit only the information in an annual report necessary to identify the borrow site and to determine the applicable annual fee.
- (c) Expedited review. Any operator of a nonmetallic mining site may request expedited review of a reclamation permit application under subsection (1) or subsection (2) as follows:
  - (1) The operator may submit a request for expedited permit review with payment of the expedited review fee specified in subsection 12.5-69(b). This request shall state the need for such expedited review and the date by which such expedited review is requested.
  - (2) The operator may submit a request for expedited review under this subsection if the applicant requires a reclamation permit to perform services under contract with a municipality. This request for expedited review shall state the need for expedited review and shall include a copy of the applicable sections of the contract and the date by which the expedited review is requested.
  - (3) Following receipt of a request under this subsection, the County of Racine shall inform the applicant of the estimated date for decision on issuance of the permit. If the applicant then elects not to proceed with the expedited review, the fee paid under subsection (1) shall be returned.
  - (4) Expedited review under this subsection shall not waive, shorten, or otherwise affect the public notice and right of hearing pursuant to section 12.5-44. This subsection does not impose an obligation upon the regulatory authority to act upon a permit application under this subsection by a specific date.
- (d) Permit conditions. Any decision under this section may include conditions as provided below:

- (1) The County of Racine may issue a reclamation permit or approve a reclamation plan subject to general or sitespecific conditions if needed to assure compliance with the nonmetallic mining reclamation requirements of this chapter. The approvals may not include conditions that are not related to reclamation.
- (2) One required condition of the issued permit shall be that the new mine obtain financial assurance pursuant to section 12.5-43 before beginning mining.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-68(a)(2) as follows:

(2) Deadline. The annual report shall cover activities on unreclaimed acreage for the previous for a calendar year and be submitted within sixty (60) days following the end of the year by January 31.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-69(a) as follows:

(a) Amount and applicability. A person who intends to operate a nonmetallic mining site for which a permit application has been submitted under subsection 12.5-41(c) shall submit a non-refundable plan review required by the schedule of fees adopted by the Racine County Board of Supervisors. The fee schedule may be adopted by resolution or through the adoption of the county executive budget. No plan review fee may be assessed under this section for any existing nonmetallic mine site for which an application for an automatic reclamation permit is submitted that meets the requirements of subsection 12.5-41(b) or for any local transportation-related mining receiving an automatic permit under subsection 12.5-45(b). A separate plan review fee shall be paid under this section for any modification to an existing reclamation plan submitted pursuant to section 12.5-66.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-70 Annual fees follows:

- (a) Areas subject to fees, procedures, and deadline, and amounts.
  - (1) Operators of all nonmetallic mining sites subject to reclamation permits issued under this chapter shall pay annual fees to the County of Racine. Fees paid under this section shall include both a share for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources under subsection 12.5-70(b)

 and a share for the County of Racine under subsection 12.5-70(c) that equals as closely as possible the costs of examination and approval of nonmetallic mining reclamation plans and the inspection of nonmetallic mining sites.

- (2) Fees paid under this section shall be calculated based on the unreclaimed acres of a nonmetallic mining site, as defined below:
  - a. "Unreclaimed acre" or "unreclaimed acres" means those unreclaimed areas in which nonmetallic mining has occurred after August 1, 2001 and areas where nonmetallic mining reclamation has been completed but is not yet certified as reclaimed under subsection 12.5-43(a)(7). However, the term does not include any areas described in subsection b.
  - b. "Unreclaimed acre" or "unreclaimed acres" does not include:
    - Those areas where reclamation has been completed and certified as reclaimed under subsection 12.5-43(a)(7).
    - 2. Those areas previously affected by nonmetallic mining but which are not used for nonmetallic mining after August 1, 2001.
    - Those portions of nonmetallic mining sites that are included in an approved nonmetallic mining reclamation plan but are not yet affected by nonmetallic mining.
    - 4. Areas previously mined but used after August 1, 2001, for a non-mining activity, such as stockpiling of materials used for an industrial activity such as an asphalt plant, concrete batch plant, block and tile operation or other industry that uses products produced from nonmetallic mining.
    - 5. Those areas within a nonmetallic mining site which the regulatory authority has have been determined to have been successfully reclaimed on an interim basis in accordance with subsections 12.5-72(b) and (c).

6. Those areas defined as not included in a nonmetallic mining site under subsection 12.5-10.

(3) Fees shall be assessed on active acres only and shall not be accessed on acreage where nonmetallic mining is proposed and approved, but where no nonmetallic mining has yet taken place.

(3) (4) Fees assessed pursuant to this section shall be based on unreclaimed acres at the end of the year. Such fees apply to a calendar year or any part of a year in which nonmetallic mining takes place, until final reclamation is certified as complete under section 12.5-72. Fees shall be paid no later than December January 31 for the subsequent previous year.

(4) For new or reopened mines that submit a reclamation permit application under subsection 12.5-41(c), the first year's annual fee shall be based upon the unreclaimed acres that are anticipated at the end of that calendar year. Such fee may be prorated based upon the number of months remaining in the year in which the application is received.

(5) If reclamation has already occurred on portions of a nonmetallic mining site, the fees for such portions may be submitted with a request that they be held by the County of Racine pending certification of completed reclamation pursuant to subsection 12.5-43(a)(7). Upon such certification, the County of Racine shall refund that portion of the annual fee that applies to the reclaimed areas. If the County of Racine fails to make a determination under subsection 12.5-43(a)(7) within sixty (60) days of the request, it shall refund that portion of the annual fee that applies to the reclaimed areas.

 The amount collected shall equal the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' share as described in Table 1, NR 135.39, as adopted by the Racine County Board of Supervisors under separate resolution, the share of the County of Racine as adopted by separate resolution and , if applicable, the reclamation plan review fee likewise adopted.

- (b) Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources share of fee.
- (1) Fees paid under this section shall, except where provided in subsection (2), include a share for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources equal to the amount specified in Table 1. For sites on which no nonmetallic mining has taken place during a calendar year, fees to be paid under this section for the following year shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00). NR 135.39, as adopted by the Racine County Board of Supervisors by separate resolution.

- (2) For nonmetallic mining sites at which no nonmetallic mining has taken place during a calendar year, the share for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources shall be fifteen dollars (\$15.00).
- (3) The County of Racine shall forward fees collected under this subsection of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources by March 31 of the year for which they were collected.
- (c) The County of Racine's share of fee. Fees paid under this section shall also include an annual fee due to Racine County, which shall be required by the schedule of fees adopted by the Racine County Board of Supervisors. The fee schedule may be adopted by resolution or through the adoption of the county executive budget.

AMEND SEC. 12.5-71(a). Regulatory reporting and documentation as follows:

(a) Reporting. The County of Racine shall send an annual report to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources by March 31 of each for the previous calendar year. The reports shall include the following information for the previous year's nonmetallic mining reclamation program:

(1) The total number of nonmetallic mining reclamation permits in effect.

(2) The number of new permits issued within the jurisdiction of the County of Racine.

(3) The number of acres approved for nonmetallic mining and the number of acres newly approved in the previous year.

(4) The number of acres being mined or unreclaimed acres.

(5) The number of acres that have been reclaimed and have had financial assurance released pursuant to subsection 12.5-43(a)(7).

(6) The number of acres that are reclaimed and awaiting release from the financial assurance requirements of this subchapter pursuant to subsections 12.5-72(a) and (b).

(7) The number and nature of alternative requirements granted, permit modifications, violations, public hearings, and enforcement actions, penalties that have been assessed and bond or financial assurance forfeitures.
