 RESOLUTION BY INDIVIDUAL SUPERVISORS OPPOSING ACTION BY THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO REALIGN STATE HIGHWAY 38 IN THE MANNER ESTABLISHED IN THE 2011-2014 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM-NO. 735

To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors:

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Department of Transportation has proposed amendments to the 2011-2014 Transportation Improvement Program ("TIP"); and

WHEREAS, amendment No. 735 involves both reconstruction and realignment of STH-38 from CTH-K to Oakwood Road in Racine and Milwaukee Counties; and

WHEREAS, the realignment portion of TIP No. 735 will require costly acquisition of a large amount of land and have considerable negative impacts to the land owners of Racine County impacted by the realignment; and

WHEREAS, the cost to maintain the remaining roadway after the newly realigned STH-38 is constructed would be an additional financial responsibility born by the government entity that takes on its continued maintenance: and

WHEREAS, the reconstruction of the existing lanes and additional lanes between Six Mile Road north to Oakwood Road is a valid and cost-effective proposal that the Board supports:

NOW. THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Racine County Board of Supervisors hereby strongly opposes the realignment portion of WIDOT 2011-1014 Transportation Improvement Program No. 735.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Racine County Board of Supervisors that the Racine County Clerk is directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin and Racine County's state legislative delegation.
