1 September 13, 2011 2 **RESOLUTION NO. 2011-41** 3 4 RESOLUTION BY INDIVIDUAL SUPERVISORS EXPRESSING THEIR DETERMINATION TO OBSERVE SEPTEMBER 11TH AS A DAY OF REMEMBRANCE 5 OF THE SEPTEMBER 11, 2001 TERRORIST ATTACKS UPON THE UNITED STATES 6 7 AND OF THE THOUSANDS OF LIVES LOST THAT DAY 8 9 To the Honorable Members of the Racine County Board of Supervisors: 10 11 WHEREAS, the Racine County Board of Supervisors supports the United States Senate's 12 call for all people of the United States to come together on September 11, 2011, in honor of the 13 10th anniversary of the terrorist attacks committed against the United States on September 11, 14 2001; and 15 WHEREAS, at 8:46 a.m., on September 11, 2001, hijacked American Airlines Flight 11 16 crashed into the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City; and 17 WHEREAS, at 9:03 a.m., hijacked United Airlines Flight 175 crashed into the South Tower 18 of the World Trade Center; and 19 WHEREAS, at 9:37 a.m., hijacked American Airlines Flight 77 hit the west wall of the 20 Pentagon; and 21 WHEREAS, at approximately 10:00 a.m., the passengers and crew of hijacked United 22 Airlines Flight 93 gave their lives to save countless others by heroically trying to retake control of 23 the aircraft, ultimately causing it to crash in Shanksville, Pennsylvania; and 24 WHEREAS, nearly 3,000 innocent civilians were killed in the heinous attacks of 25 September 11, 2001; and 26 WHEREAS, tens of thousands of individuals narrowly escaped the attacks at the 27 Pentagon and World Trade Center and, as witnesses to this tragedy, are forever changed; and 28 WHEREAS, countless firefighters, police officers, emergency medical personnel, other 29 first responders, other governmental officials and workers, and volunteers responded immediately 30 and heroically to those horrific events; and 31 WHEREAS, the Fire Department of New York, the Port Authority Police Department, and 32 New York Police Department suffered suffered 403 fatalities on September 11, 2001, the largest 33 loss of life of any group of emergency response agencies in United States history; and 34 WHEREAS, the impact of that day on public health continues, as tens of thousands are at 35 risk of or suffering from negative health effects as a result of the events of September 11, 2001; 36 37 WHEREAS, 10 years later, thousands of men and women in the United States Armed 38 Forces remain in harm's way defending our nation against those who seek to threaten it; and

WHEREAS, the lives of Americans were changed forever on September 11, 2001, when

these events threatened the American way of life; and
