

DO NOT ALLOW DELINQUENT PROPERTY TAXES TO FORCE RACINE COUNTY TO FORECLOSE ON YOUR PROPERTY

If the current year taxes are not paid in full before September 1, a Tax Certificate will be issued against the property per Wisconsin State Statute 74.57. This means if you fail to pay the outstanding delinquent special real property taxes, charges, assessments, special special taxes, plus interest and penalty, the ownership of the property will eventually transfer to the County. This transfer can occur two years after issuance of the tax certificate.

The foreclosure process involves fees for title report, certified notices and newspaper publication. These charges are added to your debt and need to be paid, in addition to the delinquent tax balance, if the property is to be redeemed.

THE "TAX" FACTS

- Real estate property tax bills are prepared and mailed mid-December by your local municipality. Please contact them if you do not receive your tax bill or if you have any questions regarding your tax bill (telephone numbers listed on back).
- Real estate property taxes are calculated on the assessed value by your local Assessor's office. Please contact them if you have any questions regarding the assessed value of your property (telephone listing on back).
- The first installment is **due by January 31** and paid to the municipality.
- <u>IMPORTANT</u>: If first installment payment is late or short, **ALL** taxes become due and interest and penalty starts accruing as of February 1st, <u>installment options would no longer be valid</u>.
- <u>City of Racine</u> allows taxpayers to pay in four(4) installments payable to the City:

 1st-January 31 2nd-March 31 3rd-May 31 4th-July 31

 After July 31, all payments are payable to the Racine County Treasurer.
- <u>All Other County Municipalities</u> allow taxpayers to pay in two(2) installments:

 1st-January 31 (to muni) 2nd-July 31 (to county)

 All payments made *after* **January 31** are to be paid to the Racine County Treasurer.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Arrange with your mortgage company to **escrow** real estate taxes.
- ❖ Try to obtain financing to pay off delinquent property taxes since interest and penalties continue to accrue at an additional 1½% each month the taxes are delinquent which equals 18% per year.
- ❖ If you are unable to pay your entire tax bill, at least make a partial payment. The Treasurer's office canno† waive the interest or penalties.
- Contact us if you file for bankruptcy, if property is for sale or held in probate. Notify us if situation changes.
- If mailing your payment, ensure that it is postmarked on or before the due date to avoid late fees.
- * Make sure your check is made payable to the proper Treasurer's Office, check is signed, the tax key number or address is referenced, and the written amount and numeric amount.

 match. Banks use the written amount and if incorrect, the check may be returned to you.
- Check your tax bill each year to make sure you are receiving the Lottery & Gaming credit if you qualify.
