WHEREAS, the Special Prosecutor program has historically been an effective tool for the District Attorney to focus on special need areas, and

WHEREAS, Child Support Enforcement and the District Attorney have worked together through the years to target prosecution of felony non-support cases, and

WHEREAS, Child Support Enforcement has been able to utilize ARRA funding during 2010 for purposes of contracted attorney services and in doing so, has realized some temporary cost savings in the budgeted account that can be redirected to the District Attorney so that additional Special Prosecutor services can be purchased, and so that the open felony non-support prosecution cases can be pursued through the end of calendar 2010.
